Comments: The UAA survey was conducted in August 2008 and no evidence of WBCR was observed. A nearby deer stand was observed. A 2005 UAA noted the presence of footpaths and fishing tackle. No interviews were conducted during.

Is the evaluated use attainable? Yes No

Comments: The stream met the maximum depth criterion at five of 10 sites and the median depth criterion at three of 10 sites. A 2005 UAA also found the stream to be meeting the maximum depth criterion. Because the depth criteria were met, the committee recommends that the WBCR use be retained. Due to evidence of secondary contact recreation (SCR), the committee recommends that the SCR use be assigned.
