Comments: A UAA submitted in 2005 noted stairs leading to the stream at site 1 of the study. Interviews conducted during the survey cite trapping, catching minnows, and hunting. One incident of swimming was reported but the department could not confirm if the location of the event was on the unclassified portion or the classified portion of Brushy Creek that currently has WBCR contact.

Is the evaluated use attainable? Yes No


Comments: The UAA was conducted in October of 2004 and no WBCR was observed. The stream did not meet the maximum depth criterion in 2 sites evaluated. Due to evidence of secondary contact recreation (SCR), the committee recommends that the SCR use be assigned.
