Is the evaluated use attainable? Yes No


Comments: A formal UAA study was not conducted and no depth measurements were made. However, due to multiple comments of WBCR, the committee recommends that this stream segment be classified and the WBCR use designation be added. Due to comments citing secondary contact recreation (SCR), the committee recommends that the SCR use be assigned. Because these documented uses are the same as the designated uses for the classified portion of Dry Fork, WBID 2041, the committee recommends that the classified segment be extended upstream to include this unclassified segment.
