



My name is Steve Herrington and I live along **Greedy Creek** just south of Bland Missouri (between Holt Road and Highway B). My family (wife, daughter, and son) and I use this creek for recreation. We wade, fish, catch crawdads, etc in the creek on a fairly regular bases. In fact there is a low water bridge just east of my land the cars drive over and we ride our four-wheelers over the bridge and splash the water all over us. The creek runs along side and across one end of my property and the water from the Bland lagoons runs into the creek close to my property. I don't believe it is right for anyone to be able to let untested water or contaminated water into the streams systems anywhere. I as an individual can't do it as I had to put a new septic and lagoon on my property when I purchased it 2 1/2 years ago. Part of the reason we purchased the place we live now was because of the creek in front of the property. We use the creek as recreation and as a teaching tool to teach the kids about the environment and wildlife.

Sorry for such a late reply. We use the creek in the manner describe below on a weekly bases. The area of the creek used is between Holt Road and Highway B. This is about a mile stretch with most of the activity on the Holt road half of the creek where I live. There is a pool about half way through this area (by the low water bridge) which at certain times may have about 2-3 feet of water in it. When deep enough (maybe 3-4 times a summer more in the spring) we do sometimes play in the pool and the kids do lay in the water. Other than that we mostly wade in the creek looking for crawdads and such.

Please let me know what the results of the findings are.

Good Afternoon Mr. Herrington,

Thanks for the comments. Could you provide more specific information on the recreational uses of Greedy Creek? Be specific as to where the different recreational uses have occurred. If you know of a deep pool where swimming occurs, please let us know where that pool is and how deep it is. Any comments on the recreational uses are great, but the ones that are the most effective are those that are specific to the type of activity occurring, where that activity occurred, how often it occurred, and when it occurred. Here's a made-up example of the type of information that would really help us: "My family has used Clear Creek in Blue County for swimming since the 1980s. We swim at the 5-foot deep hole every weekend from May to September between the low water bridge at County Road 255 down stream to the Hwy TT bridge."
