

## Necessity Findings

**10 CSR 10-6.020** Definitions and Common Reference Tables. This rulemaking will provide a maintenance update to the general definitions rule 10 CSR 10-6.020. Definitions recently added by rulemakings filed while the general definitions rule was being changed will be added to the general definitions rule. At the same time, definitions of terms no longer used in 10 CSR 10 rules will be removed. Also, several error corrections and clarifications will be made, such as reference, acronym usage, and grammatical corrections; definition applicability and language; and changes for consistency with federal definitions. This rulemaking is administrative in nature and does not impose any new requirements on sources. The benefit of this rulemaking is a clear, consistent, up-to-date single set of definitions.

- No 60-day comment period is necessary since this rule action does not affect environmental conditions or standards
- Affects entities in entire state
- Public hearing expected September of this year
- Expected to be effective February of next year

**10 CSR 10-6.161** Commercial and Industrial Solid Waste Incinerators. This proposed rule will incorporate by reference the federal regulatory requirements for commercial and industrial solid waste incinerator (or CISWI) units that were promulgated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency on February 7, 2013. This new rule will be part of a state plan to control nine (9) air pollutants from CISWI units and will shift enforcement authority for these CISWI units from EPA to the state of Missouri without imposing new requirements beyond those in the federal CISWI regulation. To meet the obligations of section 111(d) of the Clean Air Act, states must submit plans by February 7, 2014.

- No 60-day comment period is necessary since this rule action adopts federal rules without variance
- Affects 2 existing solid waste incineration units in the state: McDonald's Grocery Store in East Prairie, Missouri and ISP Minerals, Inc. in Annapolis, Missouri. Other existing units not currently subject to these requirements could be affected in the future if they elect to burn solid waste.
- Public hearing expected September of this year
- Expected to be effective February of next year
