Dear Mr. Lohse:

On June 1, 2016, Air Pollution Control Program received your request to amend Permit #072009-001 by changing Special Condition 2 from a National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) Limitation for particulate matter less the ten microns in diameter (PM₁₀) to a daily throughput limitation when operating concurrently with other plants. Special Condition 5 would also be removed requiring a set distance from the property line.

The ambient impact from the Permit No. 072009-001 is being converted to a daily production limits. This change reflects the Air Pollution Control Program's updated construction industry policy for the cessation of the use of the program's nomographs to estimate the plant's ambient impact.

Western Ready-Mix, Inc. is permitted to operate with other plants located at the site as long as the following scenarios are maintained. These scenarios are also summarized in the table below.

- When the concrete plant operates by itself (referred to as solitary operation), Western Ready-Mix, Inc. may produce up to 2,726 tons of concrete per day.
- When the concrete plant operates with any other plant, Western Ready-Mix, Inc. shall limit production to less than 2,184 tons of concrete per day.

If you were adversely affected by this permit decision, you may be entitled to pursue an appeal before the administrative hearing commission pursuant to Sections 621.250 and 643.075.6 RSMo. To appeal, you must file a petition with the administrative hearing commission within thirty days after the date this decision was mailed or the date it was delivered, whichever date was earlier. The permittee is authorized to construct and operate subject to the following special conditions:

1. **Superseding Condition**
The conditions of this permit supersede Special Conditions 2. and 5. found in the previously issued Construction Permit 072009-001 issued by the Air Pollution Control Program.
2. **Daily Production Limit For Concrete Plant**
 - A. Western Ready-Mix, Inc.'s stationary concrete plant shall limit its daily production based on the table below using Attachment A, or another equivalent form, that has been approved by the Air Pollution Control Program, including electronic forms.
