

STRATEGIC RESTORATION IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

The Strategic Restoration Implementation Plan (SRIP), included below for calendar years 2014-2016 accompanies the Southeast Missouri Regional Restoration Plan (SEMORRP) and is designed to provide greater transparency regarding the Trustees' intentions, plans and timeframes for restoration in the Southeast Missouri (SEMO). The SRIP covers both compensatory and primary restoration in the SEMO and includes the following categories of information:

- Estimated amount of money to be released
- Estimated year of release
- Type of restoration (Primary or Compensatory) contemplated
- Natural Resource or Service Target (e.g. Riparian Corridor, Upland Migratory Bird Habitat, etc.)
- Geographic priority for restoration
