Books will be picked up and delivered to the sheltered workshop for debinding and prepared for recycling then sold. This grant funds a portion of a facilities operations manager salary for \$2,185, a new 20 hour per week production supervisor salary for \$12,230, a .25FTE driver salary for \$6,210, fringe for \$3,713, and a NorTech Book De-binder for \$19,800. This project will result in at least 12 client-workers receiving pertinent job training and being assigned to the project as their job and an additional 35-50 client-workers will receive generalized job training through the project.

Basic how-to and where-to recycling information will be printed as a two-sided bookmark or tri-fold handout and posted to the Internet. A recycling newsletter including the amount of materials recycled at the community drop-off recycling center will be printed and posted to the Internet. A portable interactive education kiosk showing recyclables through various stages of the products lifestyle will be created by volunteers and the staff will create two informational display boards on waste reduction, reuse and recycling.

This grant provides for at least twelve bike collections in conjunction with local municipalities' cleanup days or other collection events within the district. The bikes will be reused/refurbished or have metal frames and tires recycled. The collected bikes then go to either the Earn-A-Bike program or the bikes are sold to the general public through Revolves non-profit bike shop.

Members pay a sliding membership fee of \$300-\$600. The new regional database will allow members to offer their by-products for sale or for free. The program is creating an expert steering committee to oversee the matching of by-products. Members also have the opportunity to network, meeting at least twice year to discuss synergies, etc.

Due to the increase in perishable produce being received, the food bank is choosing to compost the food waste rather than landfill it.
