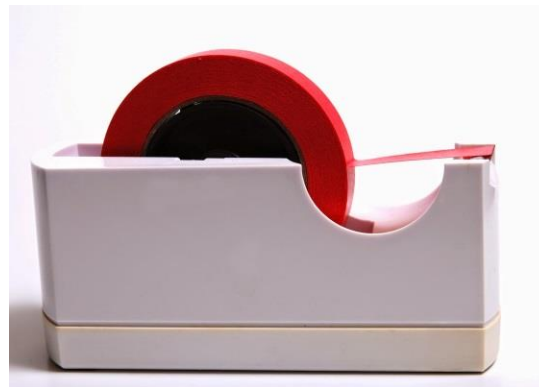

WPP Approach to Red Tape Reduction



Overview of Red Tape Reduction

- More than 24,000 restrictive words in Missouri Department of Natural Resource's regulations
 - Review restrictive words (shall, must, may not, prohibited, and required)
 - Ensure regulation is essential to health, safety, and welfare of Missouri residents
 - Remove unnecessary burdensome rules
 - Remove duplicative language
 - Remove non-relevant rules

Proposed Rule Changes

- Clarifications and consistency
 - Various citations
 - Sample types
 - Analytical references
 - White River Basin requirements

Proposed Rule Changes (Cont.)

- Redundancy or overly burdensome.
 - pH
 - Sludge management
 - References to designs
 - Schedules of compliance
 - Bypass reporting

Proposed Rule Changes (Cont.)

- New or updated items
 - Statewide nutrient monitoring
 - Influent monitoring
 - Speciation of nitrogen compounds
 - More frequent monitoring for “majors”
