

## 7.3.2.2 Special Conditions/Domestic Facilities/POTWs Only/ Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs)

### **Applicability:**

POTWs having overflow structures for sewer systems that discharge both wastewater and storm water.

(Note: Currently identified POTWs with CSOs are: Kansas City, Macon, Moberly, Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District, St. Joseph, and Sedalia.)

### **Content:**

The Central Office CSO Coordinator can assist the permit writer in inserting appropriate special conditions in the permits for CSO communities. The POTWs can be authorized to discharge from identified CSOs. The POTWs shall be required to implement the Nine (9) Minimum Controls in the plans that they have submitted to the Department. They shall also be required to submit (if they have not already done so) and implement a Long Term Control Plan (LTCP). A compliance schedule with interim milestones for implementation of the LTCP will be included as appropriate.

The Code of Federal Regulations specifies requirements for combined sewer overflows at 40 CFR 122.21(j)(8) and specifically excludes CSOs from the storm water program at 40 CFR 122.26(a)(7).
