#### Standards that apply

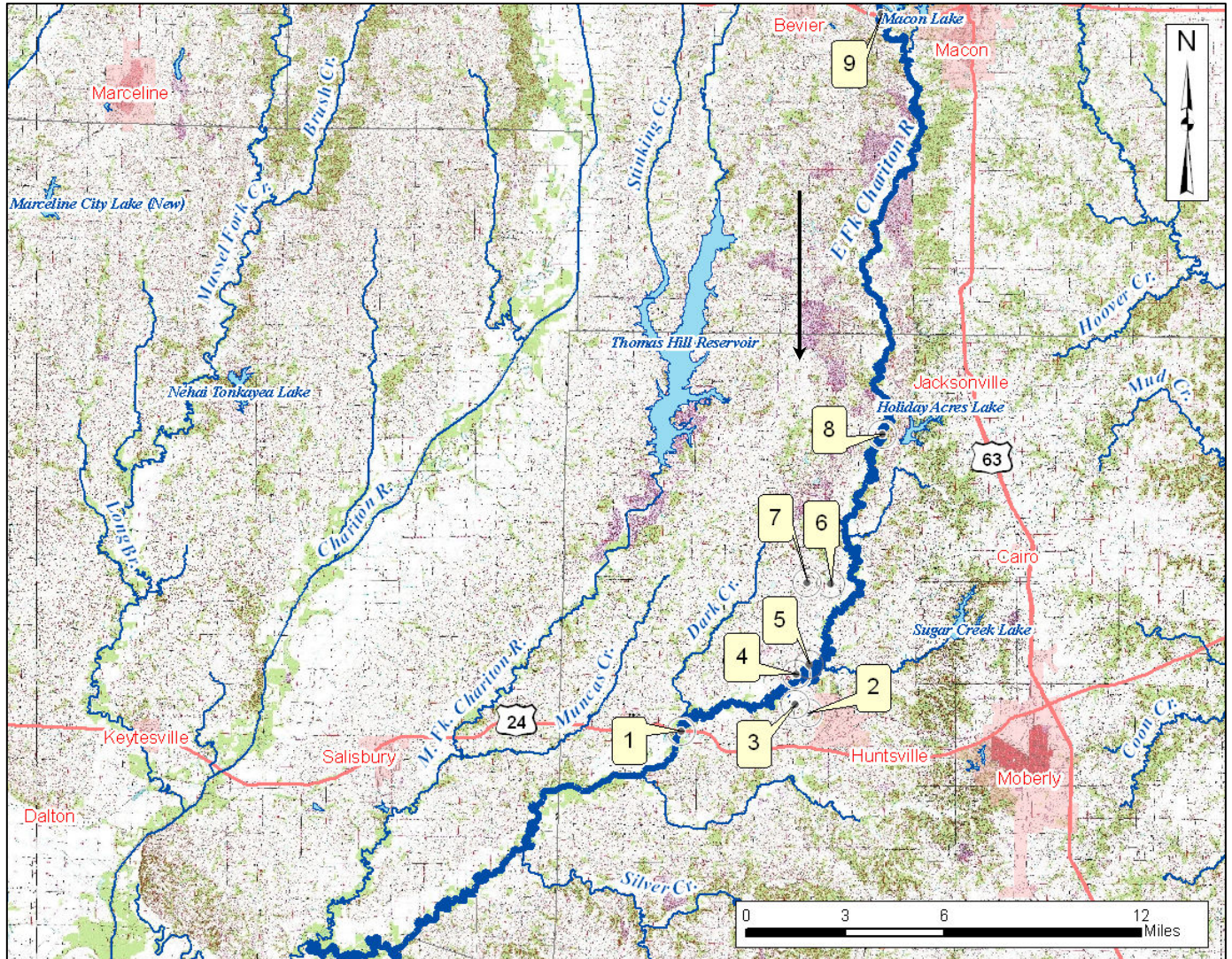
- The water quality standard for protection of a drinking water supply for sulfate is 250 milligrams per liter (mg/L or parts per million). This is found in Missouri's Water Quality Standards 10 CSR 20-7.031 in Table A

#### Background information and water quality data

The East Fork Little Chariton River flows south and then west through Macon County. It joins the Middle Fork Chariton River in Chariton County to form the Little Chariton River. Using U.S. Geological Survey data from 2002-2005, this water body was first listed in 2006. These data showed the mean (average) sulfate concentration just above the 250 mg/L criterion. Using more

recent data (up to 2008), the mean is now 227 mg/L, less than the criterion, and thus meeting water quality standards. Therefore, the river is proposed for delisting in 2010.
