
Comments: The UAA survey was conducted in October 2007 and no WBCR was observed. No interviews were conducted during the survey. However, ATV tracks leading to the stream were documented at site 3 and footprints adjacent to the stream were documented at sites 3 and 4. In addition, the 2005 UAA notes that swimming was observed, and includes comments that cite secondary contact uses including: children playing and Stream Team activities.

Is the evaluated use attainable? Yes No

Comments: The stream did not meet the depth criteria at any of the sites evaluated. However, because of WBCR (swimming) documented in 2005 the committee recommends the WBCR use designation be retained. Due to secondary contact use also being documented in 2005 and 2007, the committee recommends Secondary Contact Recreation be assigned.
