Comments: The UAA survey was conducted in August 2008 and there were no WBCR observed. There were multiple interviews from a 2005 UAA that cited swimming, wading, and fishing in the classified segment. There were multiple SCR uses noted, including horse trails and folding chairs at the creek line. There were no interviews conducted during the 2008 UAAA.

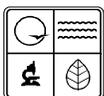
Is the evaluated use attainable? Yes No

Comments: The stream did meet the maximum depth for WBCR at site #2 and #3. It was also noted that multiple pools of >1 meter depth were located along the classified portion of the stream. It is the recommendation of this committee that WBCR use be retained and SCR be added.
