Comments: The UAA survey was conducted in September 2008 and there were no WBCR observed. The 2005 UAA cited ATV tracks, shotgun shells and footprints. The 2006 UAA cited fishing rods, fire pits and foot paths. The 2008 UAA cited graffiti under a bridge next to creek, a crude lean-to and foot paths. These are all instances of SCR use. No interviews were conducted during the 2008 UAA.

Comments: The stream met the maximum depth criteria at 1 site along classified segment for WBCR. Due to previous citing of SCR use and the stream meeting the depth criteria the committee recommends that WBCR and SCR be retained.
