SECTION E - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION & EXPLANATION OF TERMS

Cost-Based Waiver Process – The vehicle has obtained:

- 1. An emission inspection prior to any repair being made that indicates:
 - a) 'Pass' for the MIL-KOEO, On-Board Diagnostics Communications and Readiness Result portions of the inspection.
 - b) A Diagnostic Trouble Code Result: Fail.
- 2. 'Qualifying Repair,' as defined below, performed by a Vehicle Repair Technician to repair causes of Diagnostic Trouble Code(s).
- 3. Repair costs that meet the requirements of 'Qualifying Repair.'
- 4. An emission re-inspection after repairs are completed.
- 5. Submittal of this completed application along with repair receipt / invoice information detailed in Section B of this form.

Note: Should repairs totaling less than \$450 be made that correct all but one of the Diagnostic Trouble Codes, and the repair for that single Diagnostic Trouble Code is determined to be more than \$450, you may consider applying for an Estimate Based Waiver Application Affidavit (780-1994), available online at www.dnr.mo.gov/forms/780-1994.pdf.

Qualifying Repair - A repair or adjustment performed on a vehicle's emissions control system within 90 days of failing an initial emissions inspection that is reasonable to the Diagnostic Trouble Code failure. Repairs performed by a repair technician that were not authorized by the vehicle owner's signature or verbal consent may not be considered a qualifying repair. Applicable repair costs are limited to those reasonable to the Diagnostic Trouble Code failure, exclude additional parts and/or labor for repairs made for other purposes, and may consist of either:

- 1. \$450 in parts costs, spent by a vehicle owner or charged to a vehicle owner by a repair technician, that are appropriate for the type of emissions inspection failure.
- 2. \$450 in parts and recognized labor costs, charged to a vehicle owner for work performed by a Missouri Recognized Repair Technician, that are appropriate for the type of emissions inspection failure.

Note: For those who can provide government issued documentation of financial dependability on state or federal disability benefits and other public assistance programs, you may consider applying for a Financial Waiver Eligibility Request (780-1970), available online at www.dnr.mo.gov/forms/780-1970.pdf, in addition to the appropriate Cost-based Waiver Application.

Missouri Recognized Repair Technician - Any person, who:

- 1. Is professionally engaged full-time in vehicle repair or employed by an ongoing business whose purpose is vehicle repair. A Missouri Recognized Repair Technician may only be recognized by the department at one place of employment.
- 2. Has valid and current certifications from the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence in Electrical Systems (A6), Engine Performance (A8) and Advanced Engine Performance Specialist (L1).
- 3. Has not been reported by the department to the Attorney General for unlawful merchandising practices according to subsection 643.330.5, RSMo.

Costs Not Applicable To Waiver Total:

- 1. Non-Missouri Recognized Repair Technician labor costs.
- 2. Emission or safety inspection fees.
- 3. Charge for a written estimate of needed repairs.
- 4. Repairs needed to pass safety inspection.
- 5. Repairs performed before the initial emissions inspection failure or more than 90 days after initial inspection failure.
- 6. Repairs made to correct failed: On-Board Diagnostics communications, malfunction indicator light data link connector or any emissions control devices or data link connectors found to be tampered with, rendered inoperative or removed.
- 7. State sales tax for certain air pollution control devices.
- 8. Costs and expenses associated with aftermarket catalytic converter replacements that do not conform to the U.S. EPA's aftermarket catalytic converter enforcement policy.
- Expenses incurred to repair emissions control devices or data link connectors that have been found to be tampered with, rendered inoperable or removed.
- 10. Costs for emissions repairs or adjustments covered by a vehicle manufacturer's warranty.
