I have very real concerns about the health & safety of people in the area, especially the students of Saxony Lutheran High School should this quarry be allowed to locate so closely to the school.

We live close to this proposed quarry. My husband and I have heart & lung conditions, and research shows that quarry dust is extremely detrimental to these conditions. There are also several children at Saxony Lutheran High School who have asthma conditions which would also be detrimentally affected.

The additional truck traffic generated by this quarry would also pose a safety issue with so many students driving to and from school as well as other people coming to the school for ballgames and other school functions.

We have lived in this area for over 35 years, and have enjoyed relatively clean air. There are numerous people in this area who are extremely opposed to this quarry locating here, and deserve to be heard. A public hearing is the best way to allow that to happen.

We understand there is another quarry applying for a permit in the same general area which is extremely upsetting. Please give careful consideration to this matter and grant this request for a public hearing. Thank you for your consideration.





I wish to communicate my opposition to the Heartland Materials Quarry that has applied for a permit to operate in the Fruitland community. I own and reside on a farm and ranch operation near Fruitland. This quarry would directly affect me and I have the following concerns.

1) I receive income from a pasture renter who maintains a herd of cattle on my property. My renter has expressed his concerns about the effect the fugitive dust from the quarry could have on his cattle's health, if my farm rental income ceases, I will certainly be affected.


2) As a Fruitland resident, I depend on the Public Water Supply as thousands of other residents do. Since these public wells are in close proximity to the proposed quarry location, I request that you undertake how Fruitland's water supply may be affected in the future, in light of the geographic topography in this location.

3) As a Fruitland resident, I am concerned about the increased industrial traffic that will be generated around an interstate exchange which is already extremely busy due to nearby schools and daily worker commutes to some major manufacturing facilities nearby. Additionally, the quarry trucks will be emitting diesel fuel fumes into the air, which adds to more pollution. I request a study be conducted on the potential for traffic accidents, and an additional study on increased traffic and diesel emissions on air quality.

4) I also have grave concerns how quarry dust will affect our Fruitland children in nearby schools, creating health problems for now and in the future, adding to additional burdens on already overtaxed health care systems.

This 161-acre quarry will be right across County Road 601 from the new Saxony Lutheran High School of 185 students. Because of the close proximity to the school, we are concerned about our children's health because of the dust generated by these quarries. One of our daughter's is allergic to dust and has asthma. We believe her health will be compromised if this quarry is allowed to operate so close to the high school.
