


On June 5, 2007, the City Administrator and I attended your "Road Trip" meeting at the Camdenton City Hall. As you will recall, there were many residents of Sunrise Beach complaining about the above-referenced company, indicating that they were unaware of the permit application until it had already been issued, and are now dealing with many problems as a result of this operation.

A similar situation exists now with the Joint Sewer Treatment Plant which is jointly owned and operated by the City of Osage Beach and the City of Lake Ozark. We are one of the largest adjoining property owners to the proposed site of the quarry, and we were never notified by Magruder of their request for a permit. I am attaching a copy of a map showing the treatment plant property and the proposed quarry. There are two major sewer lines which run through the proposed quarry site. Should these lines be damaged, it would result in a catastrophic economic impact to the City of Osage Beach. Continuous blasting could also damage much of the treatment plant's underground tanks and create serious problems for the future of this plant.

We respectfully request that a formal hearing be held and that ALL adjoining property owners be notified and given an opportunity to discuss this matter, prior to any permit being issued by DNR for this quarry.




On Friday, July 6, 2007, the City of Osage Beach received a copy of a letter sent by you to Ms. Mary W. Denton indicating that Magruder Limestone Company, Inc., has "respectfully declined" holding an informal public meeting. The letter went on to state that she had fifteen days from June 26, 2007 in which to submit in writing a request for a hearing, and that the letter would then be presented to the Land Reclamation Commission at their September 27, 2007 meeting.


Once again, neither the City of Osage Beach, nor the City of Lake Ozark, who jointly operate the Lake Ozark-Osage Beach Joint Sewer Plant, one of the largest adjoining property owners, were notified that Magruder Limestone Company had respectfully declined holding an informal public hearing and that we had fifteen days in which to notify the Land Reclamation Commission of our desire to pursue such a hearing.

As we stated in our previous letter to both you and Doyle Childers, Department of Natural Resources Director, there are two major sewer lines that run through the proposed quarry site. Damage to these lines would result in a catastrophic economic impact to both cities, as well as the State of Missouri which depends heavily on the taxes paid by tourists every year. It is evident that the "livelihood" of both cities would be unduly impaired should this permit be issued and Magruder allowed to blast in this area.

Accordingly, please consider this letter as our official request to hold a public hearing for the benefit of all concerned.





