DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Greek Revival style theater building, built 1855-1857, two stories and basement, rectangular plan, originally 50 x 103 feet, brick construction. Front (west) portico has four unfluted Doric columns constructed of wedge-shaped brick. Wooden pediment (above) and architrave (below) complete gable under ridge roof.

Cast iron columns in basement support main floor. These columns originally continued up through the first floor space to support the second floor.

Original surviving exterior ornamentation includes: window frames, entablature mouldings, column and pilaster capitals, and iron scrollwork bolted to the cast iron window lintels.

Evidence of Victorian influence noted particularly in use of cast iron ornamentation, establishes building as late example of the Greek Revival style.

Basement originally used as reading room; main floor used as combined theater and lecture hall or auditorium. Second story housed the city hall, Masonic and Odd Fellows hall. (History of Howard and Cooper Counties, Missouri, 1883, p. 663; and Boonville Weekly Observer, May 17, 1856, p. 2, col. 2.)

Building was in need of repair at end of nineteenth century and was in danger of being razed. Owner W. Speed Stephens hired architect T. W. Bast of Sedalia, Missouri, to design remodeling of second floor. (Boonville Weekly Advertiser, August 31, 1900, p. 1, col. 1.) On April 5, 1901, plans were made public announcing an extensive renovation and enlargement of the auditorium to provide an opera house. (Boonville Weekly Advertiser, April 5, 1901, p. 1, col. 5.)

Architect for the auditorium enlargement was J. L. Howard of St. Louis, who specialized in theater design. (Boonville Weekly Advertiser, May 17, 1901, p. 1, col. 1.)

This enlargement required the removal of the east (rear) wall and an addition was constructed lengthening the building by approximately 25 feet. New space accommodated more elaborate stage mechanisms and provided rooms for the musicians and heating plant. (Boonville Weekly Advertiser, May 24, 1901, p. 1, col. 1.) First floor was sloped into original basement area to make possible better viewing of stage. Other interior alterations included: removal of several second story support columns, construction of balcony over rear third of auditorium, application of ornamental plasterwork, and extensive reworking of lobby.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

Mid-nineteenth century civic, theatric, and cultural center of unusually early date (1855-1857) for its period and location (modest size midwestern town). According to a survey conducted in 1936 by the State Historical Society of Missouri, building is the oldest surviving theater used continuously for that purpose, west of the Allegheny Mountains. (The Boonville Advertiser, Dec. 25, 1936, p. 1, col. 3-4.)

Thespian Hall is also significant in Missouri's political history as many campaign speeches were delivered there during the nineteenth century. A typical example is the campaign rally of General George Rapoon Smith of Sedalia, Missouri who ran in 1872 on the Republican ticket for a seat in the legislature. (The Missouri Historical Review, vol. 34, no. 1, October, 1939, p. 112.)

Built 1855-1857 at a cost of \$22,000 (Nathan H. Parker, Missouri As It Is in 1867, 1867, p. 238) or at a cost of \$16,000 according to another source. (The Boonville Daily News, Oct. 3, 1936, p. 1 and p. 4.) Original estimated cost of building was \$10,000. Thespian Hall was built and owned by the Boonville Library, Reading Room and Thespian Association, organized 1855, as an outgrowth of the Thespian Society of Boonville, organized before 1838. (A Brief History of Thespian Hall, p. 2 and p. 6.) Building funds were raised by the sale of Association stock. (Boonville Weekly Observer, June 9, 1855, p. 2, col. 3, and March 29, 1856, p. 2, col. 2.) Local contractors Homan and McDearmon, later a mayor of Boonville, built the Hall. (Boonville Weekly Observer, June 9, 1855, p. 2, col. 3, and March 29, 1856, p. 2, col. 2.)

Four years after completion of the Hall, the Thespian Association was disbanded because of the Civil War. During the War, Thespian Hall served first as a quartering place for troops and later as a hospital and horse stable. (The Boonville Daily News, Oct. 3, 1936, p. 1 and p. 4.)

7. Original character of total exterior has been maintained. Brick used in addition closely matches that of original building. Addition is set apart from earlier building by its greater height, mansard roof, fenestration pattern of walls largely unarticulated and small round windows at freize level of old building.

Small exterior balcony at second floor level on the facade replaced an earlier balcony added after completion of building. Balcony presently in place may have been added during 1900 renovation. Dates for both balconies not certain. Modern neon sign, attached below the level of balcony to the central Doric columns, detracts from the appearance of the facade.

Brick on facade painted white. Some cast iron ornamentation has fallen off and has not been replaced. Several chimneys present in old views have been removed. (See bibliography.) Windows altered to become doorways in the front wall flanking main entrance. Several first floor openings in north and south walls have been bricked in.

Currently building is basically sound, but in need of refurbishing.

8. In the War years, Thespian Hall became the property of Col. J. L. Stephens. In 1869 it was leased to the Turn and Gesang Verein, a German singing and athletic society. (Elston J. Melton, The First Hundred Years, 1957, p. 17.)

After 1900-1901 renovation undertaken by owner W. Speed Stephens, Hall was reopened as The Stephens Opera House, Nov. 5, 1901. (Boonville Weekly Advertiser, Nov. 8, 1901, p. 1, col. 1.)

Circa 1912, Thespian Hall was converted to a motion picture theater and was renamed The Lyric. Later it was adapted to sound films.
