



Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) Emissions from Point Sources in Missouri




Nitrogen Oxides (NO_x) Emissions from Point Sources in Missouri




Trends in Eight-hour Ozone Design Values St. Louis and Kansas City Areas and Rural Site (Mark Twain)




2007-2018 Yearly Number of Days with Ozone Exceedances (> 70 ppb) at the State Air Monitoring Sites



Cumulative Number of Ozone Exceedances (>70 ppb), 2007-2018




St. Louis, Area Mo. Trends in PM_{2.5} Design Values Based on Annual Averages, 2003-2018


Kansas City Area, Mo. Trends in PM_{2.5} Design Values Based on Annual Averages, 2003-2018

St. Louis Area, Mo. Trends in PM_{2.5} Design Values Based on 24-Hour Averages, 2003-2018








Ozone and Particulate Matter Status

Currently Designated Nonattainment Areas



What does this mean for St. Louis?

- **Nonattainment New Source Review** applies for ozone in St. Louis City, St. Louis County, St. Charles County, and Boles Township in Franklin County. PSD permitting applies in all other areas.
- **Transportation conformity** no longer applies for PM_{2.5}, however, it continues for ozone due to a recent court decision.
- **State and federal emission control** rules relied upon in previous plans continue to apply.



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NATURAL RESOURCES

Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂) Status

2010 SO₂ Standard (75 ppb)

Round 1: Existing Monitors

- 2013: Two nonattainment areas designated (portions of Jackson and Jefferson counties).
- 2018: Monitoring attainment for both.

Round 2: Consent Decree

- 2015-2016: Three areas considered. EPA did not designate any nonattainment areas

Round 3: Data Requirements Rule (Modeling)

- Dec 2017: EPA designated remaining areas in Missouri as unclassifiable/attainment.
 - Except Iron and New Madrid counties


Round 4: Data Requirements Rule (Monitoring)

- 4 areas installed new air quality monitors
- 2017-2019: Collect air monitoring data
- Dec 2020: Deadline for EPA designations

- 2015 Ozone Standard
 - Infrastructure SIP (Adoption Request at March 28 MACC meeting)
 - Transport SIP (Public Hearing at March 28 MACC meeting)
- 2010 SO₂ Standard
 - Jackson County Maintenance Plan
 - Boundary Recommendations for undesignated areas

Federal NAAQS Updates

- **CO, Lead and NO₂:** EPA has not released an update
- **SO₂:** On Feb. 25, 2019, EPA retained the 2010 standard, without revision
- **PM and Ozone:** EPA is expected to release a proposal in early 2020 with a final rule to follow in late 2020

State Rulemakings

Red Tape Reduction

- 100% of department rules reviewed
 - 101 rules in Title 10, Division 10
- 38% reduction in restrictive words
- 20% reduction in total rules
- 64% of department rules were amended/rescinded
 - Air: 20 rescissions and 40 amendments
- Over 300 comments were received and considered

Red Tape Reduction (Cont.)

- Last set of RTR air rules will become effective March 30, 2019
- Submitting state rules to EPA for inclusion in SIP, as appropriate
 - EPA approval of submittals is required before state rules will be federally enforceable
 - Approval could take up to 18 months per Clean Air Act

Beyond Red Tape Reduction

- Additional rulemakings expected in 2019
 - Approximately 46 additional rules in review
- These rules were delayed due to workload and priority.
- Changes include rule clarification, reference updates, and addition of definition(s)
- Workgroup for 10 CSR 10-6.410 forming

State Planning

The department's Air Pollution Control Program develops multiple plans to meet federal standards for six criteria pollutants: lead, ozone, particulate matter, carbon monoxide, nitrogen dioxide and sulfur dioxide. These plans constitute one main state implementation plan (SIP).

The EPA reviews pollutant standards every five years. Sometimes, a review results in a tightened standard. When this happens, the multi-step process to draw up a new SIP begins again. It's not uncommon for work on the old and new standards to overlap. The department considers input from all stakeholders when developing a SIP.

EPA has recently approved two maintenance plans and redesignation requests that affect the St. Louis area. This means EPA has redesignated the area from nonattainment to attainment for the 2008 ozone standard and the 1997 fine particulate matter standard. The department has developed a whitepaper summarizing what the redesignations mean for the area.

Requests for Compliance Assistance Visits

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources wants to help businesses, communities and industrial facilities better understand environmental regulations — and avoid associated violations. Regulated entities may request compliance assistance visits by completing the form, below, or by contacting one of the department’s **regional offices**.

A compliance assistance visit would benefit a new facility as well as a facility facing changes in permits or regulatory requirements. In addition, when facilities undergo a change in status or management, a compliance assistance visit can help smooth the transition.

What occurs during a visit?

The itinerary of a visit depends on the request. In general, a department representative will meet with staff at the facility and do some or all of the following:

- * Explain regulatory requirements and provide updates, as applicable.
- * Help a regulated entity achieve and maintain compliance with permitting requirements.
- * Answer questions about permits, offer suggestions and discuss issues that arise during the meeting.
- * Serve as an ongoing resource. After an in-person visit, the department representative can continue to provide assistance via email, telephone or another in-person visit.

Please note that the department does not intend compliance assistance visits to serve as comprehensive inspections or to result in final determinations of compliance or noncompliance. However, if the department representative observes problems with compliance, the representative will provide recommendations on handling the issues and ask the facility to address the situation. If the representative sees a violation that poses imminent harm to human health or the environment, the representative will notify the facility of the serious violation, and the department will perform a compliance inspection.

Oversight of Stack Tests

Testing & Emissions Unit:

- Receives and reviews test protocols
- Observes emissions test
- Reviews test reports
- Received 438 test reports in 2018
