He said operations are working normal and there haven't been any malfunctions or breakdowns to cause any excess of dust in the air. He did mention that they will have a new sawdust storage bin in the new building that will cut down on some of the particulates. The main barrels will be processed in this new building with less manufactured in the main building now. There was no particulate matter leaving the property at the time of inspection, nor was there much in the air at the time of investigation on site.</p> <p>No further investigation required on this concern at this time.</p>

Burning usually occurs 2 - 3 times a month, starting around 7:30 a.m. and getting done by around noon. The RP brings in junk and burns it. What doesn't burn is taken off for recycling. CP did not know who the RP is, but I was able to find the previous concerns to populate the information. Previous concern listed RP as Tyson Dezling; but information from the business listing on the Secretary of State's website suggests the last name is actually Devling. On the articles of organization, Mr. Devling's address is listed as 2789 SW 169 Highway, Trimble MO 64492. Using street view in Google Earth, I saw a sign in the yard that has the same phone number from the previous concerns (816-985-5959).

Caller phoned to complain about trucks leaving the Central Plains Cement Company. The caller had arrived home around 18:30 to find what they described as "flyash" (a fine powder) covering the River Blvd at the intersection of River Blvd and Kentucky at the end of their driveway. Caller said that trucks leaving the cement plant were stirring the dust up and describing the scene as hazy from dust being kicked up by passing trucks. Caller was concerned about her respiratory health as well as issues that might present themselves from migration of the material. Caller stated that there was a pile on the road in front of the VFW as well.

Based on the caller's description, I phoned Central Plains Cement Company (816) 2573683 to inquire about the event. I spoke to a man who identified the position he was working as "loadout dock". He was fully aware of the situation and said others had called, even called their environmental department. He indicated the material spilled originated from his facility. He said they were trying to get a hold of "Transwood", a trucking company, who he claimed had a truck that did not latch his end gate and caused the spill. He said they had some folks going to go up and assess the area in which the spill occurred. When asked about the product that was spilled, the man said it was "Cement Powder".

I phoned the MDNR duty officer to inform them of the contact that I'd made with the initial caller and the Central Plains Cement Company.

The smell is so strong that it fills my home too. I have inside pets who don't care for it at all. I read that the company just got a 200 million dollar investment so my family and I would greatly appreciate any kind of inspection or monitoring someone could do at the plant and also to please share with the local communities who are also impacted by the paper mill. I know that the emissions are really strong because of how long the smoke cloud lingers in the air above our heads. Clouds move, change, shift... Not these clouds. They hang around for hours. I plan on calling the paper mill to see what future plans they have for monitoring the emissions. They mentioned on their website how the plant will provide 200 jobs but doesn't mention any environmental upgrades. Good for economy is bad bad bad for the environment. Money means more to these people than our air and water. Sad.

Comments Because the Phoenix Paper Mill is located in Wickliffe, Kentucky, the State of Missouri does not have the authority to regulate this plant. For this reason this environmental concern was referred to Mr. Jarrod Bell, Branch Manager in charge of the Field Operations Branch in the Division of Air Quality in the Commonwealth of Kentucky's governmental system. I spoke with Mr. Richard Pitts, Foreman of the asphalt plant at Capital Materials. Mr. Pitts stated that the asphalt plant had been operating at night and that he did not know of any malfunction or other equipment problems that would contribute to any odor problems. He stated that the particular asphalt mix did have more additive than normal and that there was some odor from the additives used. Mr. Pitts also stated that about two nights were left to finish the night work.

A violation per 10 Code of State Regulations 10-6.165 Restriction of Emission of Odors requires the use of a Nasal Ranger with a 7:1 dilution ratio with the odor detected or perceived twice at least 15 minutes apart during the time period of one hour.

When I returned to the office I requested and received emissions information from both Capital Materials and Magruder Paving. No exceedances were suggested by the records. The records were received from Mr. Chris Thiltgen, Regulatory Compliance Manager for Capital Quarries and from Mr. Duane Mueller, Safety and Environmental Manager with Magruder Paving, LLC.

Comments	<p>Caroline Kargus and I responded to the site on 9-16-19. The bridge at the main entrance to the subdivision (off Hwy Y) was removed, prohibiting access. We then drove around to the south end of the subdivision via Stonehouse Road and found the back entrance that appeared to have been recently constructed by the freshly spread limestone gravel there. The gravel was a minus gravel with the nearly-white powder it contained. With the dry, sunny and warm conditions, a lot of dust became airborne when driving over it. The vegetation along this road appeared covered in the same white dust as the "minus" of the gravel road. We then drove into the subdivision and saw that the streets had some asphalt pavement but many sections of the road had the same-appearing gravel spread (for filling in ruts) and the dust accumulated on the adjacent vegetation.</p> <p>Upon return to the office, I called the complainant and explained the exemption for use of public-use roads from by 10 CSR 10-6.170 (1)(A) but offered to reach out to the subdivision trustees to determine if there are plans to mitigate and suggest possible solutions. Ms. Close informed me that the subdivision has no money and has no plans to pave the roads and this secondary entrance is also the new location for the school bus stop. Ms. Close provided me with the subdivision homeowners association president's name and number.</p> <p>I then called Mr. Josh Brower, President at 314-973-4209. He also stated the subdivision is broke and has no plans to pave the entrance, saying it would cost about \$40,000.00 to pave the entrance. Mr. Brower said they looked into applying water when dry but that too was expensive. I said that road watering would likely make things worse with the resultant tracking out and around. I suggested applying a dust suppressant, which typically helps for a couple of months and, with winter coming, may not need to reapply until next Spring. Comments The office of EPA Region 7 received this complaint (via epa.gov.website) on August 20, 2019 and forwarded it to this office on September 20, 2019. Following investigations in response to similar problems (smoke from cremation units) noted by the neighbors did not find violations. I visited the facility on September 30, 2019. I walked around the building and observed the venting stacks from all directions. I met the owner of the facility, Mr. Joe Broder (636-724-8116) in his office.

I told Mr. Broder the purpose of my visit and asked him if he has noticed any recent smoke release from operating the cremation units (there were three cremation systems on site at the time of the visit). He told me that he did not observe any smoke and stated that if there was, the automatic system would have alarmed the operators.

Broder Cremation Services, Inc. is an air pollution source (183-0248) and is operating under Construction Permit #05213-011 issued in May 2013. The APCP notified the facility (January 30, 2018 letter) that it no longer is required to keep a Basic Operating Permit. Mr. Broder indicated to me that he is in the process of replacing one of the 3 old cremation units with a new unit that is efficient and bigger in capacity.

A Construction Permit Application was submitted to the APCP on September 20, 2019. Mr. Broder stated that the new unit will be installed and start operating in December 2019.

I did not see greyish white smoke being released from facility operations.

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Comments I investigated the concern previously on 10/2/19 and was unable to detect the described burning tire odor, but did observe a faint fertilizer odor that did not appear to be originating from Component Bar Products. I reported my findings in a voicemail to Ms. Dana Johnson.

I called Ms. Johnson on 10/15/19 for more information. She explained that the odor always began around 3:30 in the afternoon, and that she could smell it on her back deck almost every day. She explained that the neighborhood was built on agricultural land, and that they had previous issues with manure/fertilizer odors, but that this burning tire odor was different. I told her that I would come by in the afternoon sometime the following week and that I could meet her at her property.

On 10/23/19, I visited Component Bar Products at 3:00 PM. Wind was blowing from the south at 12 mph. I was unable to detect any odors in the parking lot and shipping/receiving areas around the building. I drove around the neighborhood including the trailer park to the south of Component Bar Products and did not observe any odors or see any potential sources of tire odors. At 3:30 I met Ms. Johnson at her house at 1381 Stockbridge Dr, directly north of Component Bar Products. I stood on Ms. Johnson's back deck, where I could observe the roof of Component Bar Products, approximately 200 feet away. I observed a slight intermittent oil/petroleum odor, which seems to come and go with the wind, which was blowing from the direction of Component Bar Products. Ms. Johnson told me that this is the odor she has been smelling, and it is usually observable at this time, but on the day she originally called (9/30/19) it was so strong she couldn't stand to be outside. I explained that the slight odor I was observing would not be enough to warrant a violation, but that I would go down and investigate the source and let her know what I found.

I visited Component Bar Products directly afterward (around 4:00) and spoke with Elizabeth Richards. I explained that I was back because we received an additional concern, and that this time I was able to detect the odor when on the concerned party's property, but that it was not strong enough to be a violation. Ms. Richards told me that since I was out the first time, she and other staff had noticed a fertilizer odor, but it was not coming from them. I agreed that there was likely another source for the fertilizer odor, but I believed the oil/petroleum odor was different and that I was trying to find its source. We walked around the building and into the back (northeast) corner, where they received and load shipments of parts and products. There were slight diesel fumes from an idling truck, but nothing significant. Inside the building, I observed where the facility stored its used oil. I observed the same odors that I noticed on Ms. Johnson's property, but still only slightly observable. Ms. Richards explained that oil was used in nearly every part of their manufacturing process, and that their degreasers collected oil, which was stored and reused. We walked through the rest of the building, through their machining processes, and I did not observe any more odors.

I believe that the oil storage and usage throughout the many machining processes taking place in Component Bar Products accumulates in the ambient air, which is quickly moved and through their ventilation system and released through the roof vents, which are close enough to Ms. Johnson's back deck
