These notes are a summary of discussions during the meeting.

Alice Geller welcomed the workgroup to the sixth and last meeting. Ms. Geller briefly went over the agenda for the day.

The meeting began with a discussion of consensus ideas from the workgroup. The workgroup then moved into a review of the proposals submitted by some of the members. Some proposals were combined efforts of several workgroup members. There were proposals from the Attorney General's Office, Citizens Legal Environmental Action Network, and a coalition of animal agriculture commodity groups.

The department presented information on a new technique to evaluate odor using gas chromatography, mass spectrometry and olfactometry to analyze an odor. The workgroup thought this technique had promise. The department will continue to look into its use for future odor evaluations.

The Missouri Air Conservation Commission's meeting is July 26. Ms. Geller and Leanne Tippet Mosby will compile the draft document and provide it to the workgroup by July 7. The workgroup decided the document will have these parts:

- Introduction – a brief summary of the workgroup's efforts. Alice Geller will draft.
- Background – a brief summary on why the Odor Workgroup was formed and current odor regulations. Ms. Tippet Mosby will draft.
- Summary of workgroup discussions – the table summarizing proposals with advantages and disadvantages provided in the workgroup notes.
- Consensus items – those proposals the workgroup came to consensus on. The descriptions will come from the meeting notes.
- Proposals from workgroup members. The three proposals from the AGO, Citizens Legal Environmental Action Network, and a coalition of animal agriculture commodity groups will be included.
- Closing. Alice Geller will draft.

Comments will be due back to Ms. Tippet Mosby by July 14. Ms. Tippet Mosby will make any changes to the document, and it will then be provided to the MACC. The workgroup asked Ms. Tippet Mosby to make the presentation to the MACC. There will be time on the Commission meeting agenda for anyone to provide comments about the workgroup's effort.

Ms Geller and Ms. Tippett Mosby then thanked the workgroup for their time, efforts and candor during the last 6 months, and the meeting ended.
