Dear Mr. Ouhl:

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources' Air Pollution Control Program has completed its review of your request to place a new temporary portable crusher screen to stockpile crushed rock to be used as base material in the coal dome, clinker silos, and other facilities, along with providing crushed rock for surfacing the unpaved portions at Holcim (US) Inc. Ste. Genevieve, located in Bloomsdale, Missouri. The Air Pollution Control Program is hereby granting your request to conduct this temporary operation at this location in accordance with Missouri State Rule 10 CSR 10-6.060(3).

You will be in violation of 10 CSR 10-6.060 if you fail to adhere to the specifications and conditions listed in your application, this permit and the project review. Specifically, all air contaminant control devices and emission units shall be operated and maintained as specified in the application, associated plans and specifications.

Operations approved by this permit expire on the date indicated above. Also, you must have the operations approved with this permit (and not approved elsewhere) rendered non-operational before the operations approved under permit number 062004-005 start-up.

According to the project review, you are well within the daily National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for particulate matter 10 micron at your maximum daily production rate of 9,600 tons of crushed stone. No record keeping will be necessary since your equipment is not capable of exceeding the limit.

You are still obligated to meet all applicable air pollution control rules, Department of Natural Resources' rules, or any other applicable federal, state, or local agency regulations. Specifically,


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you should avoid violating 10 CSR 10-6.045, *Open Burning Restrictions*; 10 CSR 10-6.220, *Restriction of Emission of Visible Air Contaminants*; 10 CSR 10-6.170, *Restriction of Particulate Matter to the Ambient Air Beyond the Premises of Origin*; 10 CSR 10-3.090, *Restriction of Emission of Odors*; and 10 CSR 10-3.060, *Maximum Allowable Emissions of Particulate Matter From Fuel Burning Equipment Used for Indirect Heating*.

A copy of this letter should be kept with the unit and be made available to Department of Natural Resources' personnel upon verbal request.
