

**CITCAT Meeting Notes**

November 12, 2019, 5-7 pm

Mid-County Fire Station, Camdenton MO

**Meeting called to start by Chairman**

**Minutes**

Minutes for the previous meeting were approved by the Advisory Team.

**General Discussion**

A draft of the site/project "Status Table" was presented by Pam Holley. Members approved the format. MDNR will provide updates before each meeting.

On October 21-28, 2019, MoDNR oversaw sampling and measuring activities at monitoring wells in the area. MW sampling was also conducted during the week of October 28 by the Missouri Geological Survey (MGS) to survey the wells status for analyses, data validation, and evaluation of groundwater. This will help determine if our understanding of the wells and hydrological setting is still current. Transducers will be used during the standard pumping and recovery test. This will occur over several weeks. This will also include chemical analyses.

The revised report for the investigations conducted this year at the 221 Sunset Facility was sent to MoDNR approximately one month ago. Reviews do take time as the reports are extensive. Review should be completed in the near future. The next step will be to have a Corrective Measures Study (CMS) done for the Site.

Now that MGS is involved at the Sites, reviews have slowed a bit as they were done in sequence. To expedite agency reviews, MoDNR's RCRA and Superfund programs, and MGS will review reports concurrently going forward.

The sampling from soil borings at the 221 Sunset Facility is now, for the most part, considered to be complete. There may be a few data gaps to address as part of the CMS but those will be discussed if needed.

## **Introduction of Guests**

Rick Mai of Sunrise Beach, MO introduced himself. He has been a resident in the area since 1998. His group is interested in purchasing the 221 Sunset Facility property and would like to put the building at the Site to use. He has a couple of interested parties already but, for one, the ceilings may too low. The other is looking for a location for a medical marijuana facility. He introduced his son and wife to the attendees. When asked if they would be using the entire property, he stated that they are just wanting to use the main building and parking lots. He is planning on buying the property and is not afraid of the impacts – he understands that the Site will be remediated.

Further discussion with MoDNR, Group members and community participants continued on potential future use of the Facility for some time. Topics included prevention of vapor intrusion, remediating the source, the extensive air cleaning properties of certain uses, being able to start work or use of the Facility prior to cleaning of the source, historic indoor air levels being low with the existing HVAC, benefits to the community for having a new industry in Camdenton, operation of the facility, and other related topics.

## **Other Sites**

Discussion was held regarding the Camdenton Treatment Plant Lagoon (CTPL). MoDNR should have results from the second sampling event conducted and a report coming out on what was found, which will be published on the MoDNR website.

Community members discussed their questions and concerns regarding the historical disposal of sludge/wastewater municipal facilities. They indicated that historically, trucks would take materials to various locations around the airport to use on unknown destinations, possibly roads or drives. They had observed these trucks going down their roads many times. They were concerned that runoff from these disposal locations had potential to travel to nearby farmlands downgradient of the area. Further discussion clarified that they were speaking of a different property than the known Sludge Disposal area at the airport. MoDNR encouraged attendees (and the public) to share information they may have on possible sludge truck runs from various operations to areas and yards around the airport. They cannot act without more details and information as they do not have the resources to blanket the entire area with sampling activities. It was discussed that MoDNR has acted on public information before and found things – they are open to it but need detailed information to justify an investigation. Attendees indicated they would speak with community members who had witnessed this and advise them to let MoDNR know their observations and locations involved.

Meeting was adjourned by the Chairman.

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Potential agenda topics for the next meeting will be decided outside the meeting at a future date.
