A. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Gary Vandiver called the meeting to order in Jefferson City, Missouri, at the Lewis and Clark building at 10:31 a.m.

A roll call was taken and the following commissioners were present via the telephone: Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver.

Chairman Vandiver apologized for the cancellation of the May 22, 2014 meeting, due to lack of agenda items. A full Commission meeting will be held June 10, 2014.

B. SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS

1. Cover Crop Project Update

Jim Plassmeyer presented the Cover Crop Project update. Mr. Plassmeyer stated a Cover Crop Pilot began in fiscal year (FY) 2013 with the Chariton County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD). The Commission approved funding for the pilot practices for four years to evaluate the policies. During this time, program staff worked with the SWCD board members and staff, and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) staff to evaluate how policies are working that have been in place for the pilot.

There are two levels of participation in the cover crop pilot policy. The first level is to be eligible for three years of incentive payments based on a corn-soybean rotation. The second level of participation is eligible for four years of incentive payments and is based on a corn-soybean-wheat rotation. The cover crop(s) depends on the crop that was planted the prior season.

Currently there are 23 cooperators participating in the Cover Crop Pilot through the Chariton SWCD with a total of 693 acres. Mr. Plassmeyer presented comments and suggestions from the Chariton SWCD board and staff, and NRCS staff which were: tier level participation is hard to manage with landowners changing cropping rotation; consider a one or two-year payment cycle; maintain the no-till requirement; the requirement of a nutrient management plan may deter participation, therefore, possibly look at a farm fertilizer management requirement; the incentive rate can be reduced; grazing of cover crops should only be allowed after a set amount of growth of the covers; keep using a ranking system for eligibility; and keep an acre limit per landowner.

Program staff will work with Chariton SWCD to modify policies for an expanded pilot practice after approval from the Commission on modified policies. Acre limits will be determined and unobligated FY15 Nutrient and Pest Management funds will be used for the statewide pilot to begin July 2014.

Policies and commission consideration of an expanded pilot practice will be presented to the Commission at the June 10, 2014 meeting.

After discussion and questions from Commissioner Bradley regarding use of cover crops in furrow irrigated cropland, Commissioner Vandiver stated a different policy may be needed in the areas that are graded annually.

Commission Vandiver stated he appreciates what Chariton SWCD has done with the pilot project.

C. REQUEST/REVIEW

1. **Johnson SWCD – Request to Reconstruct Storm Damaged Practices Under Maintenance**

Jim Plassmeyer presented the Johnson Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) request to reconstruct storm damaged practices that are currently under maintenance. Mr. Plassmeyer stated that Johnson SWCD is requesting cost-share funds for a localized catastrophic rainfall event that occurred the first weekend in April 2014. The district received approximately eight inches of rain in a 24-hour period. This caused failure of DSL-4 and DSL-44 terraces and DWP-3 waterway practices throughout the county.

The cost-share reconstruction policy states, "Reconstruction assistance is available for practices that failed during the maintenance life of the practice. Districts must request cost-share if a single storm event causes widespread failure of state cost-shared structural practices. The request must document the seriousness and the extent of the damage, along with estimates of costs for repairs. The request to provide assistance for reconstruction must be approved by the Commission before the board approves the contract. The district must attach a copy of the approval letter to the Documents section of the MoSWIMS contract."

The Johnson SWCD has identified at least 25 state cost-share practices under maintenance that received significant damage and landowners requested assistance through the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP). The district is requesting \$15,000 in emergency assistance with potential of \$50,000 as damage is documented. The Johnson County Farm Service Agency (FSA) requested ECP funding. The ECP funding was granted, but not for practices still under a maintenance agreement by stating "A producer is not eligible to receive compensation to rehabilitate any land on which a producer is required to maintain the practice or the land under any other Federal or State Cost-Share program."

The Johnson SWCD district technician estimates that many of the breaks in the terraces are 15-20 feet wide based upon visual appraisal of one site. The earth moving component in Johnson County is \$2.45 per foot for DSL-44 and \$2.21 per foot for the DSL-4 terrace practices.

Mr. Plassmeyer stated that in the past, for most reconstruction requests, the Commission has approved district boards to assist landowners with the reconstruction, using funding from their regular allocation. The boards had the responsibility to prioritize use of their funds on reconstruction projects and/or new projects. In 2011, the Commission provided additional cost-share funds to assist with flood and storm damaged practices throughout the state.

Commissioner Bradley stated these weather events are becoming more common.

After discussion, H. Ralph Gaw made a motion to approve the Johnson SWCD request allowing cost-share to rebuild practices still under maintenance that were affected by this event by providing additional funds for FY14 of \$15,000, capping out at \$50,000, to cover any practices that can be completed in FY14. Practices not completed until FY15 will be funded out of the district's FY15 regular Sheet, Rill and Gully allocation. Charles Ausfahl seconded the motion. Johnson SWCD stated that most of the practices have already been repaired. Commissioner Vandiver stated he thought that would be the situation in Johnson SWCD since they are proactive. Jim Plassmeyer stated that a second consideration will be presented addressing the practices that have already been repaired.

A poll vote was taken. Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.

Johnson SWCD also requested approval to provide cost-share to landowners that have already started and/or completed the storm damage repairs from this event for practices still under maintenance. Johnson SWCD has at least five practices that were rebuilt by the landowners before the ECP waiver had been denied based on guidance provided to them by Farm Service Agency (FSA) anticipating funding.

Commission policy states: "Cooperators who start a practice before receiving official notification of approval from the board are not eligible to receive cost-share, and cannot be approved for a cost-share payment."

After discussion, H. Ralph Gaw made a motion to approve the Johnson SWCD request to provide cost-share to landowners that have already started and/or completed the storm damage repairs from this event for practices still under maintenance. Thomas Bradley seconded the motion. A poll vote was taken; Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.

2. Callaway SWCD – Request Approval for Lease Agreement for Demonstration Pilot Plot

Jim Plassmeyer presented the Callaway SWCD request for approval to enter into a lease agreement for a demonstration plot. Mr. Plassmeyer stated that in Missouri Statutes Chapter 278.120.2 it states “A soil and water district through the board of soil and water district supervisors thereof shall have the following authority and duty in addition to other authority and duty granted in other sections of this law.” Chapter 278.120.2(5) states “To make and execute contracts and other legal instruments, necessary for the saving of the soil and water in that district, subject to approval by the state’s Soil and Water Districts Commission.” Based on those statutes, this request has been brought before the Commission.

The owner of the United States Department of Agriculture building approached the Callaway SWCD to lease 5.79 acres of land adjacent to the building to be used as a demonstration plot for cover crop activities. The lease would cover several years and was reviewed by the Missouri Attorney’s Generals Office representative for the Commission, Tim Duggan.

Charles Ausfahl stated this would be a good project and very visible. Commissioner Vandiver commended Callaway SWCD for bringing this project forward and stated this will be a great location to show the project.

After discussion, Charles Ausfahl made a motion to approve the Callaway SWCD board’s request allowing them to enter into a lease agreement to establish a cover crop demonstration plot. Furthermore, the Commission is not responsible for the local decisions made in carrying out the contract details. Thomas Bradley seconded the motion. A poll vote was taken. Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor and the motion passed unanimously.

D. SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAM DIRECTOR’S COMMENTS (CONTINUED)

Colleen Meredith stated the August Commission meeting has been potentially scheduled for August 8, 2014 pending Commissioners schedules, at the Missouri State Fair. This location is planned so the Commission can recognize Richard Fordyce, Director, Missouri Department of Agriculture, for his years of service on the Soil and Water Districts Commission during the meeting. This will be the proposed meeting date suggested at the June 10, 2014 Commission meeting.

Commissioner Vandiver thanked Jim Plassmeyer for getting everything organized for a conference call meeting. He also thanked the program office for getting the packet material out, as well getting through it quickly.

Vice Chairman Gary Vandiver called the meeting to order in Jefferson City, Missouri, at 1:35 p.m. Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver were present, which made a quorum.

C. REQUEST

1. Supervisor Requests

a. Cass Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD)

Cody Tebbenkamp presented the Cass SWCD supervisor appointment request. The Cass SWCD Board requested the appointment of Ms. Melinda Steckley to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Ed Winter who passed away. Ms. Steckley and the board vice-chairman signed the Verification of Supervisor Eligibility form verifying the candidate meets the qualifications to serve on the board.

Charles Ausfahl made a motion to approve the appointment of Ms. Melinda Steckley to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Ed Winter. H. Ralph Gaw seconded the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

b. Marion SWCD

Charles Ausfahl made a motion to approve the appointment of Mr. Doug Wilson to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Gale Behring. H. Ralph Gaw seconded the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

c. Mercer SWCD

Matt Elliott presented the Mercer SWCD supervisor appointment request. The Mercer SWCD Board requested the appointment of Mr. Anthony Henke to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Lynn Moffatt due to his resignation. Mr. Henke and the board chairman have signed the Verification of Supervisor Eligibility form verifying the candidate meets the qualifications to serve on the board.

H. Ralph Gaw made a motion to approve the appointment of Mr. Anthony Henke to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Lynn Moffatt. Charles Ausfahl seconded the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

d. Miller SWCD

Allan Clarke presented the Miller SWCD supervisor appointment request. The Miller SWCD Board requested the appointment of Ms. Sharon Paterson to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Mike Keeth due to his

resignation. Ms. Paterson and the board chairman have signed the Verification of Supervisor Eligibility form verifying the candidate meets the qualifications to serve on the board.

H. Ralph Gaw made a motion to approve the appointment of Ms. Sharon Paterson to complete the unexpired term of Mr. Mike Keeth. Charles Ausfahl seconded the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

2. Declaration of Disestablishment of Platte River Tributaries Watershed District by Worth SWCD

Jim Plassmeyer presented the request from Worth SWCD. The Worth SWCD requested that the Commission recognize the disestablishment of the Platte River Tributaries Watershed District and to sign the certificate of disestablishment.

Mr. Plassmeyer stated that a watershed district is established under RSMo 278.160. He stated that the watershed districts are sponsors of the Watershed Protection and Flood Prevention Act PL-566 projects, which are funded through United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Natural Resources Conservation Service. (NRCS). The watershed district authority includes acquiring land easements, right-of-ways for the structures; the power of eminent domain and the authority to assess taxes to maintain the structures. He stated that the PL-566 is a USDA program that provided funding for the design and construction of flood control structures with a maintenance life of 50 years or longer.

Next, Mr. Plassmeyer provided some background information on the Platte River Tributaries Watershed District. He stated that there were 11 structures (dams) that were built and the trustees received a letter from NRCS stating when the economical life would be met by the structures. He also provided the procedures for the disestablishment. He pointed out that all of the procedures had been met for the disestablishment of the watershed district.

After some discussion, Thomas Bradley made a motion to approve Chairman Vandiver to sign the Certificate of Disestablishment recognizing the disestablishment of the Platte River Tributaries Watershed District. H. Ralph Gaw seconded the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

D. SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS

1. Supplemental Cost-Share Allocation

Alan Freeman presented the Supplemental Cost-Share Allocation process. He stated that at the June 10, 2014 Commission meeting, the Commission authorized a 10 percent increase in the fiscal year (FY) 2015 cost-share. The funds were

allocated to the districts on September 24, 2014 and the 10 percent increase in allocation was limited to the district's FY15 Needs Assessment.

Next, Mr. Freeman covered the proposed supplemental cost-share allocation parameters: it will be a rolling allocation process; a threshold of 90 percent obligated of the total allocation in each Resource Concern(s) must be met; the allocation amount for qualifying resource concerns will be \$20,000; allocations will start on Thursday, October 9, 2014, and then will follow a schedule. He stated that the Missouri Department of Natural Resources Soil and Water Information Management System (MoSWIMS) Master Fund Status Report will be reviewed at the end of the day on October 9, 16, 23, November 6, 13, 20 and December 4. He pointed out that MoSWIMS would be locked on the following days to load the allocations and that an email will be sent to the districts receiving additional funds. He stated that in some instances, districts may receive 100 percent of their FY15 Needs Assessment in a Resource Concern and MoSWIMS would be the "gatekeeper" in managing the FY15 cost-share appropriation.

After discussion, H. Ralph Gaw made a motion to concur with allocating supplemental funds to districts that meet the 90 percent obligated threshold based on the proposed process. Charles Ausfahl seconded the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

2. **FY16 Cost-Share Needs Assessment**

Alan Freeman stated that the FY16 Cost-Share Needs Assessment memo had been sent indicating October 31, 2014 is the deadline for the districts to submit their Needs Assessments. He stated that the numbers received will be presented to the Commission at the December meeting.

3. **Technician Survey**

Patty Chapman presented the results of the Technician Survey. She stated that at the June 10, 2014 Commission meeting, the Commission directed staff to survey districts regarding technician certification. On August 21 the survey was sent to the districts with a deadline of September 19, and 104 districts submitted responses to the survey. She pointed out there are 120 Technician II staff statewide. She stated that of the 92 districts that have Technician II staff, 31 districts do not have their Technician II sign off on cost-share documents. Some reasons indicated by the survey that districts do not sign off for completion of practices is that boards feels it is a liability, NRCS staff prefer to sign and/or the boards prefer NRCS to sign, the technician does not feel confident to sign or a combination of the above. She pointed out that 20 of the 31 districts showed that NRCS prefers to sign or the board prefers NRCS to sign. She stated that the survey asked if NRCS had given job approval authority for other practices and 30 districts responded, yes.

After some discussion, H. Ralph Gaw made a motion that Technician II staff will have the responsibility to sign off on the required practices included in the Technician II certification beginning January 1, 2015. Charles Ausfahl seconded

the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

4. Follow Up – District Comments on Request to Extend Original Maintenance Life for Stream Buffer Practices

Alan Freeman presented the follow up to the request to extend original maintenance life for sensitive areas. He stated that Hickory SWCD requested to provide an additional out-of-production incentive as the maintenance life expires on WQ10 Stream Protection Buffer practices. This would also include: N391 Riparian Forest Buffer, N393 Filter Strips and WQ10 Stream Protection. The issue is should the Commission provide an incentive to extend the maintenance life of buffer practices. Mr. Freeman provided some background on the issue. He stated the Commission has not historically paid for maintenance on practices beyond their lifespan, with the exception of the BDSP-31 Sinkhole Buffer. He stated there is no data collected on landowner intentions to maintain or not maintain a practice beyond the maintenance life. He stated that in response to Commission direction at the June 10, 2014 meeting, a memo was sent to the districts to solicit comments with the comment period through July 25, 2014.

Mr. Freeman stated that 19 districts submitted comments, four districts opposed extending the maintenance life on buffers, four had no position and 11 were in favor. Some of the comments in support were: it would encourage landowners to keep the practice in place; protect sensitive areas especially when so many acres are being put in crop production creating more erosion; provide additional time for natural regeneration; and reduce the need for more costly erosion control measures. Some of the comments in opposition were: landowners will maintain conservation practices without further incentives; it would be an additional cost to the program; it may reduce funding for new buffer installations; and may be paying landowners that intended to maintain the practice anyway. Some comments received that were neither for nor against were: suggested five years rather than 10 for maintenance; feel landowners will want to continue to maintain buffers without incentive; and if a landowner has already decided to remove the buffer, an additional incentive may not have an impact.

Duane Mackey, Hickory SWCD, stated that they had about 10 landowners that had come to the office to ask about continuing their buffers. He stated that they surveyed the landowners that were close to the end of the 10-year lifespan and 80 percent of the landowners indicated that they were going to start grazing that area. He covered some of the pros and cons of the issue in his district. He stated that a majority of their landowners will not continue to maintain the practice without an incentive.

After some discussion, Thomas Bradley made a motion to direct staff to do additional research on potential incentive payments and maintenance life, and develop a draft practice policy for Commission review. Charles Ausfahl seconded the motion. When asked by the Chair, Charles Ausfahl, Thomas Bradley, H.

Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

E. PUBLIC COMMENTS

1. John Sebastian

Mr. Sebastian addressed the Commission concerning wells. He stated that in 2007 the price was \$5.44 and in June it was \$6.44, so over a seven year period why did the cost for drilling not go up more?

Colleen Meredith stated the Commission would receive more information on the cost of wells in his area at the December Commission meeting. The program office is waiting for the districts to submit their drilling costs.

Mr. Sebastian asked how the price for wells is determined. Ms. Meredith stated there is a State Average Cost for components. This is determined by the prices districts input into a database from paid invoices. She stated that NRCS has the State Cost Database; the actual costs from the receipts that the districts have entered are used to develop a state average cost. She reminded everyone that the database is only as good that the information entered into it.

Mr. Sebastian asked why an operator could not be paid instead of the landowner for installation of cost-share practices?

Ms. Meredith stated there are several practices where an operator can receive payment. She stated those are more management practices where the operator incurs the payment, such as pest management, nutrient management and cover crops. The other practices are normally a structural practice installed on the landowner's property that enhances the value of the land. She pointed out that this issue is being discussed in one of the Plan for the Future subcommittees and that she appreciated Mr. Sebastian's participation.

Chairman Vandiver thanked Mr. Sebastian for his comments.

F. SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS (CONTINUED)

1. Missouri Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts (MASWCD) 2013 Resolutions

Colleen Meredith presented information on the MASWCD 2013 Resolutions. She stated that every year at the Training Conference the MASWCD provides a set of resolutions and the Commission/program generally sends the association responses to the resolutions prior to the next year's Training Conference.

Next, Ms. Meredith reviewed the resolutions with the Commission along with the proposed response for each of the resolutions which will be submitted to the MASWCD.

NOTE: At 3:10 p.m. the Commission no longer had a quorum as one of the commissioners needing to leave. No action was taken on the remainder of the agenda items.

2. Health Insurance Update

Jim Boschert presented an update on the 2015 health insurance for the district employees. He stated that Memo 2015-003 was sent to the districts explaining the health insurance. In fiscal year (FY) 2014 the districts spent \$1,441,000 for health insurance. He stated there are approximately 225 district employees that have the insurance.

Next, Mr. Boschert provided the premium costs for the calendar year 2014 and the calendar year 2015. He stated that for 2014, the employee portion of the premium for the PPO600 and the PPO 1000 was \$41.00. For 2015, the employee portion of the premium for the PPO600 will be \$70.00 and for the PPO1000 it will be \$41.00. He stated that the open enrollment period for district employees will be from October 6 to November 7, 2014. He pointed out that Osage SWCD had sent a letter asking that the program office look at other options for health insurance. He stated that health insurance is one of the issues that the Program Delivery and Operations Subcommittee has been discussing.

After discussion, Angie Cole from the Osage SWCD stated that their board was asking the Commission to explore additional options for health insurance. She pointed out that the health care market has changed significantly over the last seven years and would like to see if there are other options.

The Commission suggested that that the Program Office look into other health insurance options.

3. Plan for the Future Subcommittees Updates

Colleen Meredith informed the Commission that several of the subcommittees will be meeting in the next couple of weeks. She stated that some of the subcommittees are at a point to start drafting part of the document. She stated there would be another report at the Training Conference.

4. Update on Webster and Jasper SWCD Cost-Share Maintenance Violations

Jim Plassmeyer presented an update on the Webster and Jasper SWCD cost-share maintenance violations. He reminded the Commission that these were brought to them at their March meeting. He stated that they were forwarded to the Attorney General's Office. The Jasper landowner has made repayment and the Webster landowner has been notified by the Attorney General's Office about pending litigation. He pointed out the program office had received a copy of a letter from the landowner requesting a payment plan.

G. REPORTS

1. **University of Missouri**

Dave Baker thanked NRCS and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources for working with the University to move forward on continuity for the soil health lab. He stated they have a team in place to do training on the Farm Bill. He stated they are doing four regional meetings looking at the crop side of the bill. He pointed out the dairy portion had been done in two or three places around the state. He stated the other issue they are discussing is the type of assistance they are going to provide producers on the forms that they need for Farm Service Agency.

2. **Department of Conservation**

Clint Dalbom stated that all of the MDC Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) incentive funds had been obligated. These funds are for wildlife friendly practices on CRP land. He also stated the Wild Turkey Brood Survey information had been received and it showed substantial gains in most of the state. He stated there has been an increase in small game, quail and pheasants. He pointed out they have updated their website regarding deer and turkey seasons.

3. **Department of Agriculture**

Judy Grundler stated this year there is an abundant harvest and the need for more farm storage. She stated MDA had put together a fact sheet on what you need to know about storing grain on their website. She pointed out they have finished their survey work on the Thousand Cankers Disease. She informed the Commission that the Governor's Conference on Agriculture is scheduled for December 18th, 19th and 20th at Tan Tar A.

4. **Natural Resources Conservation Service**

J. R. Flores stated a decision has been made regarding the Field Office Service Areas (FOSA) reorganization. Currently, NRCS has a total of 54 FOSAs which will be reduced to 30. During the open comment period they received 40 comments, of those, 25 were from soil and water conservation districts. NRCS is now working on how the new FOSAs will be staffed. Mr. Flores stated he is not going to close any offices in Missouri.

Next Mr. Flores discussed the Regional Conservation Partnership Program. He stated there were 39 proposals with Missouri as the primary sponsor, or a partner. Of the 39 proposals, 12 were selected for further submittal. He stated he has completed 11 letters of support for the 12.

Mr. Flores informed the Commission that NRCS was able to obligate 100 percent of all 2014 Farm Bill funding received.

5. Missouri Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts

Kenny Lovelace stated the MASWCD Training Conference is scheduled for December 10-12 at Tan Tar A. The theme for the conference is Partners in Progress. He provided some additional information regarding the conference.

Mr. Lovelace stated he has heard concerns regarding how to best get the practices on the ground now that there is more funding. He asked if it would be possible to have a meeting between JR Flores, Sandy Stratman, Colleen Meredith and himself to discuss more employees to get the practices on the ground.

Sandy Stratman invited the Commission to their Employees Annual Meeting that would be held at the Training Conference.

6. Department of Natural Resources

Kurt Boeckmann stated that the Nutrient Loss Reduction Strategy went out for public comment on September 17, 2014 and runs until October 31, 2014. He informed the Commission that the strategy was out on the web. He stated they received a lot of input from agriculture stakeholders and soil and water conservation districts. He stated the document was promulgated by EPA, but is not a document that EPA needs to approve or disapprove. He stated that EPA asked all the Mississippi River Basin states to develop a strategy to address the hypoxia issue in the gulf.

Next, Mr. Boeckmann updated the Commission on the Our Missouri Waters RCPP.

H. ADJOURNMENT

H. Ralph Gaw made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 4:05 p.m. Thomas Bradley seconded the motion. When asked by the chair, Thomas Bradley, H. Ralph Gaw and Gary Vandiver voted in favor of the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Proposal for Cover-Crop Demonstration Area

Introduction: The use of cover crops improves soil health and promotes soil biology as well as the prevention of soil erosion. In order to educate and promote “good soil health”, the Audrain Soil and Water Conservation District would like to implement a Cover Crop Demonstration Plot on their office grounds to display the benefits and methods of using Cover Crops. This will be a non-profit project and will only be used for the purposes of demonstration, education, and to gather information for landowners.

Objective: Due to the growing interest of cover crops and the new cover crop pilot program through DNR-SWCP, the Audrain SWCD board and staff developed the idea of a demonstration plot to better understand the practice from an operator point-of-view, and identification of beneficial cover crop species. Additionally, the plot will serve as a location to create a potential food opportunity as a summer community garden to share with the community through harvest and donations to local food banks.

Methods: The entire plot dimension will be 20' x 40'. Treatment combinations will be arranged in a split plot. Whole plots will be two cover crop treatments, Cereal Rye/Red Clover and Oats/Turnips/Radish. Cereal Rye/Red Clover will represent cover crops grown in fall and winter then terminated in spring prior to planting of the primary summer crop. Oats/Turnips/Radish will represent cover crops grown in fall that winter kill from frost. Subplots will be two tillage treatments, no-tillage and conventional tillage. Both tillage methods are common in Audrain County. The cover crop and tillage combinations create a total of four plots, each with a dimension of 10' x 20'.

To construct the plots, chemical was purchased and applied to a 20' x 40' grassed area. A chemical applicator license was not required for the application as the chemical used was Group 9 Herbicide. The Audrain County USDA Service Center is owned by Constance Marie Sydenstricker Trust. Constance generously donated the area of property to the Audrain Soil and Water Conservation District to use for this project.

The plot was measured, flagged and sprayed with a District owned ATV sprayer on August 26th of 2014. Chemical burn-down killed current vegetation within the plot area to ensure good seed to soil contact for the no-till system, eliminate plant competition and allow for easy working of the soil for the conventional tillage system. After chemical application, the area was then burned with prescribed fire in a controlled fashion with a back-burn and flappers when the conditions were optimal. The fire removed the dead thatch of grass for better cover crop establishment. The prescribed burn took place on September 4th, 2014. The conventionally tilled sub plots were tilled on September 8th, 2014. On that same day all cover crop treatments were seeded and a mix of 12-12-12 fertilizer for nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium was applied.

The species of cover crops were selected based on termination characteristics and availability. The Cereal Rye and Red Clover are species that are easily available and would provide the opportunity to learn about spring control of the species. Additionally, the Cereal Rye and Red Clover germinate at

cooler temperatures during the fall allowing good vegetative growth. The Red Clover will provide nitrogen fixing in the soil as it is a legume. The Oats/Turnips/Radish was used for winter termination. They were also selected for their ease of availability and casual germination temperatures. The brassicas should have been seeded 2-3 weeks prior but this simulated the later seeding dates in a corn-bean rotation. All species will provide additional benefits to the intended purposes of the plot such as to provide erosion control, add in organic matter to the soil and provide potential pest reduction for the community garden.

Partners: For the duration of this project, staff of the Audrain County SWCD and USDA-NRCS- have agreed to provide labor, equipment, and expertise to ensure that this demonstration plot -and outreach effort is successful. Eddie Sydenstricker, the landlord of the USDA Mexico Service Center has agreed to donate the area being used for the plot. MFA of Mexico has also contributed seed. A small amount of info/ed funds from the district allocation may need to be utilized for any expenditures that are not donated.

Benefits: As the interest in cover crops rise, the Audrain SWCD board and staff hope to provide more useful and accurate information to- local landowners and to teach them how to get the most out of their fields while promoting soil health. The Audrain SWCD will achieve these goals through the proposed Cover Crop Plot Demonstration Area. The plot will be open year round during normal office hours to the community, general public, local landowners and supporting agencies. As we move forward in promoting soil health, we appreciate your consideration of support for our project.


I am writing today to request the allotted reimbursement for filling in (6) stone wells on my property in Jacksonville, Missouri in the spring of 2014.

I learned of this program from Field Supervisor John in the AFC Moberly Office. He informed me of the program, then came out to my property to document by depth measurement and pictures the stone wells that were to be filled. After his inspection, I purchased loads of rock and bottles of bleach to fill in the wells, following the protocol he described. Upon completion, John returned to the property to inspect the work and document the project had been properly executed. I was told he would turn in all the necessary documents to begin the reimbursement process.

Two weeks after the final inspection by John, I was contacted by Andrea in the AFC Moberly Office to deny my request for program reimbursement because the administrative paper work hadn't been turned in on time. At no time during the pre-inspection, execution or final inspection of the well job was it explained to me that additional paperwork needed to be completed by myself. Since I had paid the application fees at the beginning of the program year, I believed this particular program to be included.

I don't feel I should be blocked from the program monies due to administrative/field error. I followed the program protocols as I had been advised. If additional paperwork was required on the project, I should have been advised on that matter. Because no mention was made regarding additional applications or paperwork, I believed that I was properly enrolled in the program. Please advise of next steps in order to bring this situation to agreement.

RE: John Luecke Well Decommissioning

Mr. Luecke showed interest and intent to decommission 6 wells on two of his farms. John Kirchhoff, District Technician II conducted the site evaluation to determine eligibility. John let Mr. Luecke know that the potential sites would qualify for Cost Share Assistance. During the meeting John explained the decommission process with Mr. Luecke telling him what products could be used to close the well. John told Mr. Luecke that he would work up the specifics on a job sheet. At no time did Mr. Luecke have the job sheets that gave specific instructions on well decommissioning such as the amounts of bleach, rock, clay cap, or abandonment records. After John returned to the office he let Andrea McKeown, District Manager, know that the sites would qualify. Andrea began the paperwork process including tool kit for accurate farm plan and cost share information. Tool kit on the farms did take some time with the changes that were made with tool kit program. During this time, John Kirchhoff, was in the area and noticed the wells had been decommissioned. He took photos to document. When he returned to the office and let Andrea know, she informed him that Mr. Luecke was not approved for cost share yet. Paperwork was still being completed.

Andrea called Mr. Luecke to let him know that he would be unable to receive cost share reimbursement because he started and completed the practice prior to board approval. Mr. Luecke was unhappy and Andrea told him that she would take the issue to the board of supervisors at the next meeting. The board met on July 10, 2014. Andrea explained the situation to the board. The board implements the cost share program based on guidelines given. The board expects those guidelines to be followed by their staff and the landowners wishing to receive cost share, therefore, the board took no action. A similar case occurred in 2013 and the landowner was denied cost share.

Andrea let Mr. Luecke know that boards' decision. Andrea explained to Mr. Luecke that he could write a letter to the commission asking for reimbursement. A few days later when

SUBJECT: **Component Cost Data Entry into NRCS Actual Cost Database**

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) will compile data from the Actual Cost Database on June 2, 2014 for analysis and development of the State Component Average Cost List to be used for Fiscal Years 2015 and 2016 (advance allocation) contracts. Please be sure to enter Soil and Water Conservation Program cost data into the NRCS Actual Cost Database prior to June 2, 2014. Districts will need to coordinate with NRCS staff in their local offices to use a workstation to access the Actual Cost Database at the following link:

http://fsaintranet.sc.egov.usda.gov/states/mo/moi/Web_Aps/nrcs/actual_cost/mainmenu.asp
Please email Lauren Cartwright (lauren.cartwright@mo.usda.gov) with questions or issues that may arise regarding entry of component cost data into the NRCS Actual Cost Database.

As in past years, component cost data can be entered into the Actual Cost Database by NRCS, Farm Service Agency (FSA), and Soil and Water Conservation District staff at any time during the year. Data entered helps establish state average costs used in state and federal cost-share. It is important that districts enter accurate cost data, because this influences the amount of state cost-share payment.

It is recommended that districts enter a minimum of three entries from actual receipts for each component used in state cost-share contracts. If a component was used fewer than three times, staff should enter all receipt data available for that component. Districts can run the Component Utilization report in MoSWIMS to determine specific components used for cost-share. For example, to determine which contracts used PVC 1 ½ inch pipe (component number 155), the report would identify the contracts that included that component, in order to assist the district in locating invoices.

The program office has received several comments from districts regarding the state average cost of Earthmoving components. Some components have had few entries in the Actual Cost Database, and some of the components have had discrepancies in the cost data entered. The program office requests that districts review the component definitions and make several entries for actual cost data for the following components:

The Soil and Water Conservation Program has received a letter from the Lewis County Soil and Water Conservation District requesting assistance in pursuing repayment of cost-share funds for a DWP-01 Water and Sediment Control Basin, practice contract number R 036-09-0012, approved by the board on June 6, 2009 and payment made on July 15, 2009.

In letters from the Lewis Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors dated December 19, 2013, March 24, 2014 and June 20, 2014 you were informed of the maintenance violation on the contract. To correct the violation of the maintenance agreement, you were given the opportunity to repair the structure and bring the contract back into compliance or repay a prorated amount of the cost-share funds received. The district had given an original deadline of 30 days from the date of the first letter, December 19, 2013; a second request was mailed on March 24, 2014; and a third notice was mailed on June 20, 2014.

The district board provided more than 180 days from the date of the first letter to make repairs or make payment of the prorated amount of \$4,333.46. To date the payment has not been received nor has the district heard from you or your representative regarding the status of this payment or repairs.







The Lewis County Soil & Water Conservation District Board of Supervisors met on June 19, 2014 and reviewed the maintenance violation on your sediment retention control structure (wascsbs) that you received state cost-share assistance (R 036-09-0012). Since the maintenance violation had not been corrected by the deadline (May 30, 2014) as specified in the letter dated April 30, 2014 and does not meet the required NRCS standards and specifications, the soil district request repayment of \$4,333.46. Payment should be made to the State of Missouri, Department of Natural Resources Soil & Water Program (MO DNR SWCP). You may send the check to this office or directly to the state office. Please send to the attention of Soil & Water Conservation Program.

Within thirty days (30) of receipt of this letter you may request the State Soil & Water Commission to review the demand for repayment. This request must be made in writing and sent to the Department of Natural Resources Soil & Water Commission P.O. Box 176, Jefferson City, MO. 65102. If the commission determines that no violation has occurred or that extenuating circumstance justifies your position, the demand for repayment shall be withdrawn and you will be notified. If the Commission determines the violation did occur, they will notify you by certified mail asking for repayment.



A maintenance spot check was recently completed on your DWP-1 Water And Sediment Control Basin (WASCB) system on Farm # 2278, Tract #591, field #1, contract # R 036-09-0012 CO5, for which state cost share money was received. The district is obligated to monitor the maintenance on conservation practices for the life of the practice.

The WASCB system was determined to be not in compliance with the maintenance agreement. A problem exists with the WASCB system due to the fact that the back slope of WASCB #4 is supposed to be seeded to grass, but instead is being farmed. The channel of WASCB #3 is silted in around the riser and the trash guard is off. The channels of WASCB #1, #6, and #7 are silted in around the risers. The silted channels need to be cleaned out and shaped and graded to allow water to flow towards the risers. The trash guard of WASCB #3 needs to be installed. The back slope of WASCB #4 needs to be seeded to grass. The corrections must be completed by March 31, 2014. Please contact our office after the corrections have been made. The problem areas are indicated with blue dots on the enclosed map. Neglecting to correct the problems will result in the case being turned over to the Department of Natural Resources. Due to a major rain event on October 2nd and 3rd, 2014 a Ray County landowner's recently installed drainage tile in a terrace project has washed out of the ground. The area received between 6 and 7 inches of rain. The terraces were built in August of 2014 and were checked out and certified on September 8, 2014. There are 7 tile lines with 10 risers in the project. Two of the tile lines and risers have washed out. The remainder of the tile lines appears to be intact. During the installation of one of the washed out tile lines and risers, our district technician was present. The installation met NRCS specifications. Since the project was completed and payment made before the rain event we are asking for a variance to policy. We feel that since this occurred so soon after installation and the cost share payment (9-19-2014) that cost share should be made available for replacing the 2 affected tile lines.

Replacement cost for the 2 tile lines will be \$1823.81
