On June 1, 2012, this grant funded 600 90-gallon carts for dual stream recycling collection at curbside for the residents of Fulton for \$30,000 and \$10,000 match funds. |

FilterPave Products, LLC, formerly Eco Pave, LLC, is the exclusive distributor in the state of MO of FilterPave and FirmaPave porous paving systems which helps control storm water runoff and provides points toward LEED certification. |

The grant also funds a used forklift for \$5,000. MRC (Midwest Recycling Center) will provide consumer white goods and electronics collection events at convenient locations throughout the district, free recycling for schools with certain criteria to be met, convenient electronic recycling drop off site for businesses, schools and individuals. The box truck will be used for collection and transportation of white goods and electronics from schools, businesses and community recycling events. The forklift will be used to move pallets of materials at their facility and at community recycling events where large amounts of materials are expected. The 3/4 ton truck and trailer will be used to transport the forklift. |

The shed would be located near the ReStore and would replace a worn-out trailer. An additional 30+ area businesses have can collection bins located inside their offices. Habitat volunteers pick up the cans and deliver them to the can cottages. The can cottages are aluminum can drop-offs placed in the community. Habitat uses the funds from the 15 can cottages to build homes for Habitat for Humanity. |

Composting start-up kits will be available for purchase by workshop attendees. Up to ten teachers will receive kits free of charge and other new attendees will receive discounted composting supplies if desired. Target audiences are students, residents and science teachers in public schools in Region H. Three workshops on each topic will be offered and will be repeated during the grant cycle. |
