The City has a steady supply of waste oil from regular maintenance of City equipment and vehicles. The City will also accept used/waste oil from local residents and community businesses, free of charge.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">REGULATORY</p> <p>NOTES: The City shall contact the Department's Kansas City Regional Office at (816) 251-0700 and request a Compliance Assistance Visit to address any site specific issues. Furthermore, if the used oil is generated at a different City facility, the City of Butler will need to follow the transporter guidelines in Used Oil Transporters, Fact Sheet PUB132 as well as any Department of Transportation requirements. If the City of Butler wishes to operate as an aggregation point or collection center, compliance is required with guidance found in Used Oil Collection Centers, Fact Sheet PUB136. If the City of Butler wishes to operate as an aggregation point or collection center, the City must submit the required documents to the Department's Hazardous Waste Program for review pending approval. Furthermore, any nonexempt entity that sends used oil to the collection center/aggregation point must adhere to Used Oil Marketers, Technical Bulletin--PUB133. Publications to be reviewed by the facility are: Management of Conditionally Exempt Small Quantities; Used Oil Generators, Fact Sheet PUB131; Used Oil Burners PUB134; Used Oil Collection Centers, Fact Sheet PUB136; Used Oil Contaminated Wastes, Fact Sheet PUB153 ; Used Oil Cleanup, Packet PUB141; Used Oil Transporters, Fact Sheet PUB132 ; and Used Oil Forms. Based on information provided by the applicant, the Department's Air Pollution Control Program (APCP) has determined that according to Missouri State Regulation 10 CSR 10-6.061, Constuction Permit Exemptions, no construction permit is required from the the Department's APCP. However, the City of Butler remains obligated to meet all applicable air pollution control rules, Department regulations, or any other applicable federal, state, or local agency regulations. Specifically, the City should avoid violating 10 CSR 10-6.165, Restriction of Emission of Odors, and 10 CSR 106.170, Restriction of Particulate Matter to the Ambient Air Beyond the Premises of Origin.</p>

This subgrant includes the \$2,500.00 portion, which was previously approved by the SWMP on July 3, 2012, for emergency truck repairs.</p>
