This grant funds the day to day operations of the district and attendance at meetings, training and MORA Conference. |

Conveyor and Sort Line Taney | CC | RE | \$35,600.00 \$0.00 \$0.00 \$0.00 | Ms. Sarah Baty | This grant funds the purchase of a feed conveyor for \$12,000, a sort conveyor for \$14,000, conveyor controls for \$3,500, a transition hopper for \$1,100, freight for \$1,000 and installation for \$4,000. Tatone expanded their recycling services from businesses to include mixed residential recycling. Due to the increase in recyclables which must be sorted, Tatone needs a conveyor sorting system. Tatone Industries, Inc. employs developmentally disabled adults in Taney County. |

The grant funds shelving, bins, buckets, boxes, etc. for \$1,400, training for \$900 and advertising of \$2,695, all of which will be provided by a contractor. |

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| N2015-004 | City of Branson | CC | RE | \$3,912.00 | Ms. Sharon White | This grant funds 48 feet x 6 feet of fencing plus gates and includes reusing available fence materials for \$3,912. The City of Branson's recycling center had after hours deposits of recyclables which resulted in blowing litter. After trying small movable recycling containers, they decided the solution is to fence the mobile trailer and glass recycling bin to allow the 40 tons a year of after hours recyclables to be collected with less overflow and sorted as they are dropped off. |

| N2015-005 | Green Paws via Forsyth Schools | CC | RE | \$2,845.00 | Ms. Missi Hesketh | This grant funds recycling bins for \$2,845 including Fuel Up to Play 60 Recycler for the elementary, middle school, high school, commons area and elementary and high school cafeterias; bottle shaped containers and a football shaped container for the high school gym, concessions areas for baseball/softball fields and for the parks; one of the Evolution 40 bins for each of the county buildings and 55 gallon perfect fit bin liners one (1) for the city and county and three (3) for the school district. Green Paws is an environmental club within Forsyth Middle School with a mission to spread awareness of environmental issues within their school and community. Grant funds shall only be used for recycling bins/liners and not trash bins/liners pursuant to 10 CSR 80-9.050(2)(B)6. |

The subgrantee states it is difficult to unload and process 3 to 5 loads of recyclable materials a day and an additional trailer will help and also make the company more efficient and grow the facility. Based on the percentage of grant funds used to purchase the trailer, use of the trailer needs to be limited to pickup recyclable materials for Missouri customers or transport the recyclable materials for sale. |

| N2015-008 | EarthWise Recycling Center | CC | RE | \$5,478.36 | Ms. Korina Branson-Jones | This grant funds on-going electronics, alkaline batteries and fluorescent bulb collection and sorting by EarthWise with hauling and recycling or disposal provided by a contractor. The grant funds shelving, bins, buckets, boxes, etc. for \$1,400, training for \$900 and advertising of \$2,178.36, all of which will be provided by a contractor. This grant also funds a composter power washer for \$1,000 to make the cleaning of food collection bins sanitary and safe. Earthwise operates an in-vessel composter capable of diverting 750 pounds of food waste a day which is accessible to the public. Both Reed Springs School District and Silver Dollar City provide food waste as part of the food stock for the composter. EarthWise is a non-profit which collaborates between volunteers and the Reeds Spring School District to operate a Recycling Center located on school district property for Stone County and its surrounding communities. |
