This grant provides for the day to day operations of Region O.

Grant funds shall only be used for recycling containers and not trash containers pursuant to 10 CSR 80-9.050(2)(B)6.

The present lot is surfaced with gravel and the heavy roll off containers dig into the surface when they are loaded and unloaded. The surface must be raked or graded frequently to smooth it; otherwise, the uneven surface is a hazard to people carrying recyclables to the roll off containers.

Farm personnel will collect food waste on a weekly basis from generators in closed top collection bins. The food waste along with carbonaceous material will be added to the composter. Initially, Urban Roots Farm and Homegrown Foods will provide food waste for the composter with later expansion to local restaurants and entities in the area. Wood chips from the Springfield Public Schools will also be added to the composter. The operating equipment will be located in a high tunnel structure at the Urban Roots Farm located at 823 W. State in Springfield, MO. Urban Roots Farm will work to prepare the site facility and secure all necessary permits/waivers/licenses. The compost will be utilized by the Urban Roots Farm, for educational use in research on compost recipes and mixtures, used by the Dig-In R-Twelve schoolyard garden project for nine (9) Springfield schools and sold.

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O2015-010	Webster County	CC	RE	\$9,890.00	Ms. Linda Watts	This grant funds a clean burn multi-oil furnace for \$7,590 and heater installation for \$2,300 to burn approximately 2100 gallons of 15W - 40 oil, 1200 gallons of hydraulic oil and 300 gallon of 50W oil used by the county road department over a 2-year period to provide heat for Webster County's 2,265 square foot Road Department shop located at 1099 Brentlinger Drive, Fordland MO through on-site energy recovery. This furnace may qualify as a used oil space heater but must be installed per the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), federal law requirements (vented to the outside) and the used oil burned must meet RCRA requirements.

O2015-011	Springfield-Greene County Office of Emergency Management	CC	RE	\$39,639.00	Mr. Shea Lane	On 10-9-15, a new line item for \$1,500 for an utility vehicle trailer was approved and personnel expenses for the recycling intern was reduced by \$1,500 to \$17,700. The utility vehicle trailer shall only be used for collection of recyclables or recycling tasks. On 6-22-15, this grant funds personnel: one recycling intern, part-time for \$19,200 (\$10 per hour x 960 hours per year x 2 years), equipment: one utility vehicle for \$16,519 used for collection of recyclables from the Greene County Administration Building and the Morgue and the recycling intern to transport and consolidate these recyclables with the recyclables from the Public Safety Center, one scale for \$840, supplies: 4 brute containers, 40 gallons for \$240, 40 cartons of bin liners, 1.25 mil for \$1,360 and 10 cartons of bin liners, 1.5 mil for \$480, printing and technology for educational information on recycling for \$500 and shipping for \$500. Grant applicant states the utility vehicle is needed since the recycling intern is a contract employee and not considered a Greene County employee. The Personnel Policy Manual states only authorized Green County Employees are permitted to operate a Greene County vehicle. The utility vehicle shall only be used for collection of recyclables or recycling tasks. Grant funds shall only be used for recycling containers and recycling container liners and not for trash containers and trash liners pursuant to 10 CSR 80-9.050(2)(B)6.

O2015-012	Hansen's Tree Service	CC	CO	\$36,326.00	Mr. Mike Walker	This grant partially funds the purchase of a trommel screen for \$43,826, to process construction and demolition waste at two sites: 3341 S. Farm Road, Brookline MO in Greene County and 1506 N. Farmers Branch Road, Ozark MO in Christian County. At these two sites, Hansen's diverts 24,500 yards of demolition and construction waste such as drywall, pallets, scrap lumber and 6,000 yards of yard waste per year. Hansen's existing trommel screen cannot quickly and efficiently process the amount of demolition and construction waste being received. The new trommel screen will help with the processing of compost and mulch at these two sites and allow Hansen's to divert an additional 5-10% of construction and demolition waste from landfills in District O counties by the end of 2015.
