

Proposed District Grant Policies
Presented to Ozark Rivers Executive Board on February 17, 2009

Policy on Deadline for Installation and Operation of Equipment Purchased with Grant Funds:

Sub-grantees must have equipment installed and operating within 90 days of purchase. Sub-grantees who fail to have equipment installed and operating within 90 days of purchase will have their grants reviewed by the district board to determine if the grant should be suspended and grant funds returned. The executive board may grant exceptions to this policy on a case by case basis.

Sub-grantees are required to provide a minimum of six months of reports on the volumes of materials processed with equipment purchased through the district grant program. If necessary, sub-grantees will be required to get extensions on their grants to cover the timeframe required to report on diversion rates and/or volumes processed. Final disbursements will not be made until six months of results have been reported. The executive board may grant exceptions to this policy on a case by case basis.

Policy on Entities Eligible to Receive Subsidies Through the Special Collection Program:

The special collections program will only subsidize costs for electronics scrap for individuals. Businesses, schools, not-for-profits and government agencies may participate in the collections but must pay the full cost of recycling electronics. The executive board may grant exceptions to this policy on a case by case basis.

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
