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GOALS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

4. (A) WHAT WASTE REDUCTION GOALS DID THE DISTRICT HAVE FOR THE MOST RECENTLY COMPLETED FISCAL YEAR AND WHAT ACTIONS DID THE DISTRICT TAKE TO ACHIEVE THESE GOALS?

The district's waste diversion goal is to continue to focus on resource recovery. The district also had a waste diversion goal to continue to fund projects that include purchasing equipment/items that contain recycled content. Proposals that include surface covers made of recycled content (i.e. community trails, parks) were to be highly considered for funding. To achieve the goal of funding projects that focus on resource recovery, the advisory committee and executive board evaluated and approved five grant applications for funding in FY 14 involving recyclable material collections. Two of these applications awarded will fund the start-up of recycling collections in areas of the district where little to no recycling service is currently offered - St. Clair and Cedar Counties. The district has achieved its waste diversion goal of continuing to fund projects that include purchasing equipment/items that contain recycled content by funding four applications for said projects for the 2014 fiscal year, one of which includes surface covers made of recycled content. These four projects will serve to educate its beneficiaries on the importance of reducing, reusing and recycling. An additional FY2014 project was approved that involves educating Benton County residents by different media, including mail, on recycling in rural communities, as well as recycling tips, such as proper ways to separate and clean certain recyclable materials. The district continues to encourage cities and counties in utilizing DNR's tire round-up program.

The district's waste goals for FY 14 are as follows:

1. To fund projects proposing to divert household hazardous waste, electronics waste, waste oil (petroleum products)
2. Promote anonymous reporting of illegal dump sites
3. Solicit to member cities and counties to apply for grant funds to conduct special collection events for household hazardous waste
4. Solicit to member cities and counties to apply for grant funds to enhance existing or provide new recycling collection services, to provide recycling education, to utilize equipment/items made of recycled content, or to divert waste.

In order to accomplish said goals, the district plans to utilize advertising. During grant call, the district plans to include an emphasis on household hazardous waste, electronics waste and waste oil within newspaper and online 'grant availability' ads. The district will utilize newspaper and online advertising to raise public awareness of the anonymous, online reporting of illegal dump sites.

The district's resource recovery goal was to fund projects which involved the purchased of items made from recycled material. To achieve this goal, the district oversaw two FY13 grants, which involved purchases of equipment/items of recycled material and approved four grants for FY14 funding to purchase equipment/items from recycled content.

The district has set a goal to fund equipment/items made from recycled content. To achieve this goal, the district will give higher scores to applications which fund these types of projects. Approved by the Executive Board for FY 14 grant funds and recently receiving SWMP approval, four grants will be funded which focus on resource recovery.

11. DESCRIBE YOUR DISTRICT'S GRANT PROPOSAL EVALUATION PROCESS.

- A. Notices for "Grants Availability" are published in newspapers available within the district's six counties announcing funding available and indicating the time and location for application training. Postcards announcing "Grants Availability" are sent to each city and county office within the district, as well as all recyclers in the district listed on the most recent assessment inventory. Application training is performed between thirty and forty-five days prior to the application due date.
- B. Applicants are given thirty to forty-five days to submit proposals to the district's office.
- C. A copy of each application received is mailed to each Advisory Committee member approximately fifteen days before their next scheduled meeting.
- D. Applicants are invited to a Question-and-Answer session that is held at said Advisory Committee meeting. This gives the reviewers/rankers the chance to ask the applicant questions as a means of ensuring clarity of the proposed project.
- E. Advisory Committee reviews and ranks the applications, then makes recommendations to the Executive Board.
- F. The Executive Board reviews all of the Advisory Committee's actions and recommendations before actions are taken at the Executive Board on received applications.
- G. It is district policy that applications must receive at least fifty points to be considered for funding approval.
- H. The Advisory Committee reviews the district's target material list, district goals and application evaluation form annually and provides recommendations to the Executive Board on such; with final approval occurring at Executive Board level.
- I. Typically, the district conducts only one grant call per year.
- J. Guidance document is provided with each application. The guidance document summarizes the district's requirements and provides instructions and information on how to apply for district grants.

5. (A) The district's waste goals for FY 13 were:

1.
 - a. To fund projects proposing to divert household hazardous waste, electronics waste, waste oil (petroleum products).
 - b. To fund projects pursuing glass collection.
 - c. Solicit to member cities and counties to apply for grant funds to conduct special collection events for household hazardous waste.
 - d. To enhance existing recycling services, rather than provide grant funds to sustain said services.
 - e. To serve areas of the district that currently have little to no recycling services.
 - f. To fund projects that promote recycling education.
2.
 - a. One FY13 project funded the purchase of an oil burning furnace that was successful in diverting 3.34 tons of used oil, thus far. There were no applications received by the district to divert household hazardous waste, electronics waste, or petroleum products during the FY13 grant call.
 - b. One project was approved for FY14 funding to purchase solid rubber tires for a loader used in glass recycling. With the new tires, broken glass will no longer pose a hazard to the previously used tires in loading glass. Therefore, the sub grantee will experience lower to no tire repair costs and the glass recycling collection project will continue more efficiently.
 - c. Member cities and counties were solicited through newspaper, online advertisements and newsletters created by the administrator (Kaysinger Basin Regional Planning Commission) to apply for grant funds. During application training, potential applicants were informed of the district's scoring system and that household hazardous waste diversion is the top priority of the district.
 - d. Two FY13 grants were funded to enhance recycling operations and been successful in diverting nearly 296 tons of recycled material, thus far. Three projects were approved during FY13 for FY14 funding that will fund the purchase of equipment/supplies to enhance existing collections and/or operations in Henry, Bates, and surrounding counties.
 - e. The district's Executive Board has approved two recycling projects that will create a new service for the communities in St. Clair, Cedar, and surrounding counties.
 - f. Two FY13 projects approved during the 2012 fiscal year funded equipment/items made of recycled content for two local schools. These subgrantees went above and beyond to incorporate recycling curriculum into the classrooms. An education project was approved in FY 13 for FY 14 funding that involves educating Benton County residents by different media, including mail, on recycling in rural communities, as well as recycling tips, such as proper ways

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to separate and clean certain recyclable materials. Also, four other projects approved for funding in FY14 include recycling education in their project.

5. (B) The district's recycling goals for FY 14 are as follows:

1. Projects proposing to divert household hazardous waste, electronics waste, waste oil (petroleum products)
2. Promote anonymous reporting of Illegal dump sites
3. Solicit to member cities and counties to apply for grant funds to conduct special collection events for household hazardous waste
4. Solicit to member cities and counties to apply for grant funds for recycling collection, recycling education, purchase of recycled materials and waste diversion.
5. Support projects that demonstrate cooperative efforts within the region, enhance existing, or create new, recycling services, serve areas with little to now recycling services, and provide recycling education.

Actions the district plans to take include newspaper and online advertising to raise public awareness of these goals and to keep these goals in mind when evaluating projects. Projects approved for that have been identified to assist in meeting these goals include the following:

1. Two grant awards recently approved by SWMP review to fund start-up recycling collections to serve St. Clair and Cedar counties.
2. Three grant awards recently approved by SWMP review to enhance collections and/or operations in Henry and Bates counties.
3. Four grant awards recently approved by SWMP review to fund the purchase of equipment made from recycled content.
4. One grant award recently approved by SWMP to fund recycling education for the residents of Benton County.

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
