Focus on solid waste education throughout communities, schools, and even businesses- Recycling education and engagement in schools and within communities has greatly increased thanks to the implementation of mini grants.

Every grant proposal is reviewed and scored individually by the Executive Board members using the score sheet and criteria provided. At the next Executive Board meeting, the scores sheets are tallied and each grant proposal is voted on by a roll call vote for approval or denial. The Executive Board member abstains from voting on any grant proposal located within their county.
