## SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT ANNUAL REPORT

1 (a). What waste goals did the district have for the fiscal year period and what actions did the districts take to achieve these goals?

The East Central Missouri Solid Waste Management District Executive Board and its Advisory Council have identified needs within the region and work to address those needs as funding allows. In 2010, the counties in the Region I District collaborated to establish the East Central Missouri Recycling Center. The recycling center serves all four counties in the region and has proven to be an effective way to provide access to recycling and address other needs in the District, including electronics recycling and scrap tires. Due to this, the executive board has made the recycling center a priority. One of the needs identified in the District that is not addressed by the recycling center is household hazardous waste collection. Since funding is a concern, staff look for any other opportunities to address the issue. District staff worked with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources when the opportunity arose to have a free pesticide collection in Region I. A free collection for Missouri households and farmers was held in Montgomery County in June 2016. The event was a success with over 4,000 lbs. of waste collected from 21 participants.

1 (b). What waste goals does the district have for the upcoming fiscal period and what actions does the district plan to take to achieve these goals. Please include the types of grant proposals that will be sought for the upcoming period to assist in meeting these goals.

The District's goals are to continue to address the needs identified in its Work Program and Plan Update - again, as funding allows. The East Central Missouri Recycling Center is instrumental in the District being able to address a number of these needs in an economical manner and the facility continues to be a priority. The executive board has supported funding a grant to continue recycling operations through June 2017. It is estimated that 200 tons will be diverted from landfills.

2 (a). What recycling goals did the district have for the fiscal year period and what actions did the district take to achieve these goals?

	GOAL:	ACTION:
1	Improve convenience of recycling services and programs	The East Central Missouri Recycling Center was established in 2010 to improve the convenience of recycling services and programs. The facility is available to the residents of all four counties in the District, giving them access to one location that accepts a wide variety of materials including cardboard, paper, metals, plastics, glass, clothing/textiles, fluorescent bulbs, batteries, scrap tires, white goods, waste oil, and electronics. Having one location that accepts such a variety of items makes recycling convenient for residents. Many residents live outside of communities and do not have access to curbside service, so the facility allows them an opportunity to recycle. In addition, many of the items accepted are not typically allowed in curbside recycling programs. The facility offers convenient hours by being open Tuesday through Friday from 8:00 to 5:00 and Saturdays from 8:00 to noon throughout the year. Residents can drop off recyclables at these times. In another effort to improve the convenience of recycling, the District has placed its recycling trailer in one community which lost its recycling service. Items collected are brought to the recycling center.
2	Electronics Recycling	Residents in all four counties served by the East Central Missouri Recycling Center are able to drop off electronics during hours of operation throughout the year. They do not have to wait for (and possibly miss) a special collection. The service is free with the exception of computer monitors and televisions. A fee is charged for these items.
3	Scrap tires	After working with the Missouri DNR Scrap Tire Unit, the East Central Missouri Recycling Center began accepting scrap tires in 2012. The facility continued to provide this service and a fee is charged. Residents in the District are able to drop off scrap tires during hours of operation throughout the year.

2 (b). What recycling goals does the district have for the upcoming fiscal year period and what actions does the district plan to take to achieve these goals? Please include the types of grant proposals that will be sought for the upcoming period to assist in meeting these goals?

The Region I District Executive Board and its Advisory Committee have indicated the desire to make the East Central Missouri Recycling Center a priority. This project has had a major impact and allowed for the collection of a wide variety of recyclables. The executive board plans to achieve recycling goals by funding continued operation of the facility. Grant proposals for recycling will be accepted.

Resource recovery for the District is mainly achieved through the East Central Missouri Recycling Center. The District funded continued operation of the facility.

The District plans for continued operation of the East Central Missouri Recycling Center. Staff will explore additional opportunities for resource recovery.
