CALL TO ORDER

Chair Hunter called the meeting of the Missouri Clean Water Commission to order on September 7, 2011 at 9:16 a.m., at the Department of Natural Resources' Lewis and Clark State Office Building located at 1101 Riverside Drive, Jefferson City, Missouri.

Chair Hunter made introductions of the Commissioners, Staff Director, Legal Counsel, and Commission Secretary.

ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

Public Hearing – 10 CSR 20-8.120 Design of Gravity Sewers Proposed Rulemaking **Agenda Item #1**

Emily Carpenter, Financial Assistance Center presented the Design of Gravity Sewers proposed rulemaking 10 CSR 20-8.120. Ms. Carpenter stated that in 2008, Department staff convened a stakeholders group to review and amend the Design of Gravity Sewers regulation to update the language and provide consistency and clarity. It was proposed and accepted that the Chapter 8 Design Standards rules would be based upon the 2004 version of the "Recommended Standards for Wastewater Facilities." (commonly referred to as the 10 States Standards). Missouri is one of the original members and continues to be a contributing state to this nationally recognized standard. A draft amendment was completed in the spring of 2011 and the Commission signed a Finding of Necessity for Rulemaking on May 4, 2011.

No one in attendance commented on the proposed rulemaking. The Commission, and the audience, were reminded that written comments will be accepted until 5:00 p.m. on September 14, 2011. The Commission will take final action at the November 2, 2011 meeting.

A Court Reporter from Midwest Litigation was in attendance and the official hearing transcript is attached.

State Revolving Fund Project List Revisions
Agenda Item #3

Doug Garrett, Financial Assistance Center presented a proposed amendment to the State Fiscal Year 2012 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan (IUP). The following changes were proposed:

- Increased the eligible project costs for the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District (Missouri River Wastewater Treatment Plant) from \$34,769,712 to \$39,769,712 to rectify a program error;
- Increased the eligible project costs for the city of Brashear from \$648,500 to \$1,266,100 as requested by the city;
- Removed the city of Greenfield from the IUP as they have received funding from other sources for their project; and,
- Added the city of East Lynne to the Planning List based on their submittal of an application for wastewater system upgrades.

Commissioner Leake made a motion to approve the amended State Fiscal Year 2012 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan as proposed. Commissioner Tupper seconded the motion. The motion passed with a roll call vote:

Finding of Necessity for the Proposed Amendment 10 CSR 20-7.031 Water Quality Standards
Agenda Item #4

Chair Hunter read a statement on the Finding of Necessity stating that the question before the Commission was whether to direct staff to file the proposed rule and begin formal rulemaking discussion pursuant to Chapter 536, Revised Statutes of Missouri. He further stated that the public comment period on the regulatory impact report closed August 12, 2011, therefore, it would be inappropriate for the Commission to take comment at this time. Chair Hunter also stated that there will be additional opportunities to comment on the water quality standards as we proceed through the rulemaking process both in writing during the comment period and before the Commission when the rules go through a formal public hearing.

John Hoke, Watershed Protection Section presented the Finding of Necessity for the Proposed Amendment 10 SR 20-7.031 Water Quality Standards. He stated that the purpose of the rulemaking was to update Missouri's Water Quality Standards, making them functionally equivalent to federal standards and at the same time improving their clarity, specificity and effectiveness. Included in the proposed amendment are revisions that apply "fishable/swimmable" use designations to more Missouri waters and update existing water quality criteria and use designation tables. The rule amendment will also revise sections of the regulation to allow additional flexibility in how the Department grants variances and schedules of compliance to permitted facilities

Mr. Hoke noted that the petition before the Commission regarding designation of LaBarque Creek as an outstanding state resource water was being withdrawn for reevaluation at a future triennial review. Due to additional comments, concerns, and uncertainty within the watershed the Program deemed further review was appropriate.

Ed Galbraith, Barr Engineering, commented that he was in support of the Finding of Necessity but would like to request a 30 day period be provided before the filing of the rule since the Commission and the stakeholders just received a copy of the proposed rule the morning of the meeting.

John Madras, Director of Staff, reiterated that the Finding of Necessity would be the Commission's direction for staff to proceed with the rule and that the actual timing of the rule is dictated by Chapter 536 as well as other requirements and that the Department would be willing to continue discussions until the filing of the rule.

Commissioner Tupper made a motion to approve a Finding of Necessity for the proposed amendment 10 CSR 20-7.031. Commissioner Easley seconded the motion. The motion passed with a roll call vote. The Finding of Necessity was signed by the Commission.
