

2.3.5.3 Permitting Framework and Scope/ Permit Program Areas/Construction Permitting/ Other Public Domestic Treatment/Transport Facilities

Applicability:

All public entities that propose to construct a facility that will discharge wastewater to surface waters of the state must obtain a construction permit.

All proposed domestic sewage facilities with design flows over 3,000 gallons per day, including 1-in-10 year rainfall amounts, in which the wastewater is proposed to be irrigated or absorbed by subsurface absorption fields must apply for a construction permit.

All sewers proposed to be constructed tributary to public wastewater treatment facilities, including Public Service Commission regulated facilities, must have a construction permit issued by the department or by a local entity with a construction permit program approved by the department.

All proposed sludge treatment or sludge storage facilities must apply for a construction permit.

Content:

A construction permit is required when components of the treatment process is initially constructed, and when a component is replaced or modified that would result in a change in the facility description of an issued operating permit.

Routine maintenance activities do not require a construction permit. Activities may include replacement of like equipment, pump repair, electric control equipment repairs or upgrades, and structural repair.

The construction permit application is to be sent to the regional office with jurisdiction over the county in which the facility is located.
