

## 3.2.10 Overview of the Permit/Site Specific Permits/ Special Conditions

### **Applicability:**

Special Conditions are included in permits to ensure conformance with general criteria in the water quality standards, to address issues at a facility that cannot be addressed through standard chemical effluent limitations, to include "Best Management Programs or Plans" needed to adequately protect water quality, or address other issues using the "Best Professional Judgement" of the permit writer.

### **Content:**

Special conditions are authored by the permit writer to address issues applicable to a facility that are not in common with all or most other facilities. Special Conditions can be used to require the development and implementation of a "Best Management Practices Plan", address wet weather bypassing, specify chlorination practices and monitoring, address control of persistent, bioaccumulative and toxic chemicals, address possible changes in the permit due to Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) or other studies, and require the permittee to do special studies and reporting, etc.

The electronic permit library contains a number of conditions that may be included in state operating permits to address general criteria issues or other issues not normally addressed with specific chemical effluent limitations. The documents in the New Library folder present the standard language suggested for these special conditions. (See Other Links below.)
