This rule reduces the economic impact to the small business by eliminating the requirement to obtain construction permits for most construction activities at concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFOs). The inspection and record-keeping requirements for Class IA CAFOs are reduced.

Please explain how your agency has involved small businesses in the development of the proposed rule.

Small businesses were invited to participate in two stakeholder meetings in 2013-2014.

Please list the probable monetary costs and benefits to your agency and any other agency affected. Please include the estimated total amount your agency expects to collect from additionally imposed fees and how the moneys will be used.

There will be an annual net loss of revenue of \$18,837 to the department, as a result of fewer fees collected. Less time will be needed by staff to review industrial construction permit applications.

Please describe small businesses that will be required to comply with the proposed rule and how they may be adversely affected

CAFO owners will no longer be required to obtain construction permits for most construction activities resulting in an annual cost savings to CAFO owners of \$92,645.10. This cost savings will result in annual lost revenue to engineering consultants of \$40,320.
