
Enclosed please find a copy of the total maximum daily load study (TMDL) for Eleven Point River near the city of Willow Springs in Howell County, Missouri. We have received and reviewed your comments on the draft TMDL document and have edited it appropriately. The TMDL was public noticed from October 27 to November 26, 2000. Public comments were received and the document was adjusted when appropriate. We now submit this document as a final TMDL for review and approval by the U.S. EPA pursuant to Section 303(d)(2) of the federal Clean Water Act. All public comments received and Missouri Department of Natural Resources' (MDNR) response letters are on file with MDNR.

The Eleven Point River TMDL was developed by the MDNR, Water Pollution Control Program, to address the chlorine contamination of this water, as identified on the section 1998 303(d) list. The impairment arises from chlorine used as a disinfectant without dechlorination being required. The TMDL would be implemented by permit action.
