
This architectural survey has images that may appear as small tiles that are difficult to read. In order to enhance the size and appearance of the photos in this document perform the following actions:

There is a coffered cornice frieze which is above the window openings at the second story corresponding to the chamfered corners rather than to the straight cornice.


The porch wraps around the house beginning at the angle created by the front projecting wing and continuing around to the west until it meets with the west elevation projecting wing. The hip roof porch has a slightly projecting pediment gable over the entry area with overhanging eaves and a dentiled cornice with scroll brackets at the eave corners. The face of the pediment is covered with plastered floreate motif with the house number centered. There are exuberantly turned wooden porch posts supporting the porch. Framing the entry area and at intervals on the west porch elevation the posts are doubled with heavily turned spindle work and brackets connecting the two (see photo). The porch balustrade has a moulded handrail and turned balusters. The porch floor and structure are of wood. Limestone steps and a concrete flanking wall with limestone coping lead to the porch. There is a limestone slab walk to the house.

On the northwest corner of the house is a eight sided cupola tower with an eight sided hip roof which begins from the second story level and projects above the house roof line. There is a metal finial cap at the apex of the tower roof executed in a pineapple motif.

Beneath the tower roof eaves is a dentiled cornice with a wide frieze board. Beneath the frieze is an area covered with fishscale shingle until a board band with a narrow applied moulding defines the second story level. Beneath the moulding is another board band wrapping around the tower which acts as the window head to the window openings. The west elevation has a projecting wing which is identical to that found on the east elevation.

At the sidewalk there is a retaining wall of limestone with limestone steps leading to the walk to the house.

In the gable there is a center bay window which fits under the overhanging second story.

On the west elevation is a shed roofed dormer with pronounced splay walls. At the first story level is a flat roof sun parlor (?) which may be more recent than the house itself.
