



2. Further Description of Important Features  
Large piers support this double-deck reinforced concrete viaduct structure. The upper level is a divided four-lane thoroughfare. It extends from Summit to Liberty Streets at a 5½% grade. The lower level thoroughfare extends from Mulberry to branch roadways lower down on the bluff. The highest point of the viaduct extends 118 feet. The length of the upper deck is 2278 feet.



3. History and Significance  
A steel viaduct for cable cars was constructed in 1887 in order to provide an improved means of transportation between the downtown area and the Central Industrial District. It was replaced in 1915 by this viaduct of reinforced concrete. In 1965 the viaduct was completely restored and the upper deck of the double deck structure became a four-lane thoroughfare.

4. Description of Environment and Outbuildings  
Commercial structures are to the north and south of the western half of the viaduct. The eastern half of the viaduct spans numerous railroad tracks before terminating at the top of the bluff on Summit Street.

43. History and Significance  
 The K.C. Wholesale Grocery was organized in 1902. In 1912, as business increased, they purchased the building at this location that was occupied by the Kingman-Moore Implement Co. The present building was erected by the company in 1913/14. Spices were made on the fifth floor. All of the coffees handled by the firm were roasted, blended and ground on the seventh floor.



 This building is on a corner. The center arched entrance and the windows to each side have been closed in with glass blocks. The entrance arch is repeated on the third and fourth floors. The center bay projects slightly. The windows on the side of the building have also been altered with glass blocks.



13. History and Significance Thomas H. Swope was one of Kansas City's greatest benefactors. He came to Kansas City in 1857, invested heavily in business property and became the largest land owner in the city. He had this building erected in 1887/88. A number of agricultural implement dealers were located in this building including the Grand DeTour Plow Co.; Acme Harvester Co.; and the Pekin Plow Co.
